

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with hip roof with front gable. Concrete block foundation. Concrete steps and wrought iron railings leads up to sunporch/entry integral in west half of facade. Glazed with ribbons of double hung wood sash windows, one-over-one. Vertical siding on porch half-walls. Squared half column on porch corner. Front door is paneled and has a large light. Windows around house are double hung wood sash, transom over one, and one-over-one. Shallow cutaway bay on west elevation has pedimented gable roof. White simple drop siding. Window and door surrounds are blue green. Gray composition shingle roof. Boxed eaves with fascia boards. Large pedimented gable with a shingled kick on the facade. It has white simple drop siding also and a small louvered ventilator. Cutaway bay gable is also pedimented with a kick. Landscaped with lawn, evergreen trees, and hedge. Trellis screens the sunporch windows. Sycamores in parking area. HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): This was the home of owners Lydia Herman (ca. 1918 through 1924) and Edward and Lydia Herman Dominic (1924-1932 and 1937 through at least 1951). Edward was a fireman with Public Service Company as well as a pipefitter. Lola and Bert Doolittle, a repairman, were the renters ca. 1935-1936.
