

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Two story with front gable. Painted concrete block foundation. Carpeted concrete steps with concrete block piers with coping. Screened porch with shed roof extends across 11/12 of facade. Screen door. Siding on half-wall and porch columns. Door is paneled with large light. On east elevation a flight of wood stairs lead to a second floor entry. Windows are double hung wood sash, four light transom over one. Gray narrow lapped siding. Door and window surrounds, string courses, water tables and knee braces are rust. Corner boards, porch screen framing, screen door and bargeboards are white. Gray composition shingle roof. Across the second story windows on the facade and east elevation are bracketed hoods with knee braces. Above the string course, gable face on facade has gray cedar shingles.

Landscaped with lawn, planters of annuals and roses across facade, large fir and evergreens on west lawn, and an archway and lattices on east lawn.

Two car garage with front gable, gray composition shingle roof, gray false bevel siding and two gray batten doors. Alley access.

CONSTRUCTION HISTORY (include description and dates of major additions, alterations, or demolitions): Outside stairway added, date unknown. Re-roofed, 1987. Porches modified, 1988. Additional construction or modifications not noted in Assessor's records.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): From its construction ca. 1907 until ca. 1926, this was the home of owners Dora and George W. Stong, Stong Music. James H. Klingler was the owner, and Edna and Coy E. Klingler, local manager for Associated Industries, Inc., the residents ca. 1927-1928. Tenants while Mesa Building and Loan managed the property were ca. 1931-1935, Edith and Ray Pryor, a market supervisor for Safeway, and Mildred and Preston Dean, Dean's Camera Shop, ca. 1937-1940. Dephena and Claire V. Wagner, a salesman were the owners/occupants ca. 1941-1942. Alice Aldrich, a teacher for Hawthorne Elementary, was the owner/occupant ca. 1943-1951.
