ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Masonry, one and half story with cross gables. Concrete block foundation. Concrete steps, with concrete block plers and coping, lead up to wraparound porch with shallow hip roof on south half of facade and half of south elevation. Low half-wall of concrete blocks and coping. Five concrete block columns around porch. Paneled front door with large light. Another entry recessed in northeast corner of house has a full height concrete column on the corner. Windows are double hung wood sash, one-over-one. On southeast corner is a shallow bay with a pentagonal hip roof. Walls of house are pressed brick. First floor windows have relieving arches of gauged brick. Concrete blocks, coping, comices are painted brown. Friezes are cream. Gray composition shingle roof. Large gables on facade and south elevation are pent. Brown cedar shingles on apex of gable faces. Gabled dormers on north and east slopes have flared eaves, brown shingled walls and a pair of double hung sash windows. Friezes, comices and raking comices. Boxed eaves. Brick chimney on north slope.


Arborvitae, cedars, pfitzers and pines are planted heavily on facade and south elevation. Elms and ash trees in parking area. High wood fence around backyard.
