ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One and a half story with cross gables. Concrete foundation is partially skirted with wooden planks. Gabled wing in center of racade is flanked by porches. Wood steps lead to screened porch on east side. Narrow vertical siding on half-wall. Three-quarter height Doric column in corner. Concrete steps lead to porch on west facade with narrow siding on half-wall, with full height Doric pier. Porches have shed roofs. Aluminum screen doors, and entrance doors are paneled with single lights. A newer flight of wooden steps with 2x4 railing ascends to a landing on the second floor of the east gable. This entrance door is paneled. Windows are varied: the majority are double hung wood sash, one-over-one. Two sliding windows appear in the south elevation. An asymmetrical arrangement of different size fixed pane windows in the north elevation. Simple drop siding and corner boards are yellow. Window frames, surrounds and fascia are brown. Brown fishscale wood shingles on gable faces on all four elevations. Combination of tan and gray composition shingle roof. Boxed eaves and fascia boards. Two brick chimneys in north slope.

A small enclosed gable roof vestibule attached to west elevation leads to a two car garage with front gable roof, with tan and gray composition shingles. Garage and vestibule have simple drop siding painted yellow with brown trim. Batten swinging doors.

Minimally landscaped with small yard with four large trees.
