
ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with hip roof. Concrete front steps and stoop with black pipe railing lead to screened porch with dropped hip roof extends across three-quarters of facade. Half-wall on porch has vertical siding. Three full length squared columns on porch corners and center have cushioned capitals. Front door is paneled with large light. Windows are double hung wood sash, one over one. Gray aluminum siding simulates lapped siding and is narrow enough to be harmonious with the period of the house. Window surrounds, two corner porch columns, foundation, steps, cornice and chimney are also gray. Light gray composition shingle roof with boxed eaves and a gray painted chimney on west slope.

Chain link fence around lawn and a tall wood fence around back yard. Buib plants along facade and two large elms, a small pine and a rose bed on west lawn. Gravel parking with newly planted evergreens.

Large new carport at rear.
