ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story duplex with hip roof with cross gables. Smooth concrete block foundation and concrete steps. Two short, gabled wings are on the east and west thirds of the facade. Between them is a porch with a shed roof. Gray, simple drop, wood siding. Door and window surrounds, posts, balustrades, cornices and return cornices are white. Gray composition shingle roof. Boxed eaves, cornices and return cornices on the gables. Both gables have wood louvered ventilators. The east gable vent also has a small single window atop the louvers.

Lawn with large, high trimmed evergreens across the facade. Barberry on the west elevation. Gravel in parking area. Large silver leaf maple on backyard.

Two car, flat roof carport at the rear is supported by 6 x 6 posts.
