ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Two story with front gable. Concrete foundation. The door on the facade is flush. On the east elevation is an outside wood stairway with a wood railing. It ascends to a small balcony with wall knee braces underneath, a half wall with siding and a gabled portico with full height, 4x4 posts on the corners. The second floor door is flush. Windows are varied. Some are double hung, wood sash, one-over-one. Others are wood frame single lights, in singles and pairs. Yellow vinyl clapboard siding. Door and window surrounds, stairs, knee braces and fascia boards are brown. Window frames and stair railings are russet. Wood shingle roof with boxed eaves and fascia boards.

The house is by the alley. Backyard lawn of the main house serves as its front lawn. Yard is enclosed with a chain-link fence with woven aluminum strips.

This house was originally a barn. By 1919 it is shown on the maps with an addition, and in 1926 as a garage. Some time between 1951 and 1961, the house became a residence.


