ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One and a half story with gable on hip roof and front wing. Concrete foundation. Brick half circle steps lead up to porch with hip roof on the east half of the facade. Full height, squared, fluted columns on the front corners. Storm door with full light in the center of the porch is framed by 4x4s. On each side of the door are floor to ceiling single lights 5'x7'. Porch ends also have full height single lights. Front door is paneled. Windows around the house are double hung, wood sash, one-over-one. Gabled, cutaway bay on west elevation. Buff, simple drop, wood siding. Door and window surrounds, columns, corner boards, friezes, cornices and water table are light gray-blue. Charcoal

composition shingle roof. Wood shingles on west slope. Hip roof has hip on gable with a small window. Short wing on west facade has a hip on gable with a kick and a louvered wood ventilator. All gable faces have buff wood shingles, laid in a staggered pattern. Weathervane on front of the ridge. Brick chimney on north slope.

Lawn with brick retaining wall and piers along the sidewalk. Between the piers is a low, white picket fence. Cottonwood trees by west elevation. A high wood fence is around the backyard. Ash tree in parking area.

One car garage at rear with front gable, wood shingle roof, buff board and batten siding, and batten doors. Alley access. An adjacent building has side gable, wood shingle roof, and buff, simple drop, wood siding.
