ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with front gable roof. Battered foundation is stucco. Concrete stoop covered by shed roof supported by full height, squared posts. Trellises with climbing plants on two sides. Front door is paneled with a large light. Side gable roof extends across the north elevation with exposed rafter ends. Windows around the house are pairs of metal frame sliding windows. House is sided with stucco painted white. Rafter ends, bargeboard, porch posts and trellises are white. Green composition shingle roof.
 Landscaped yard with tall hedge along sidewalk. Two young trees along street. Flower beds along foundation.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): The house, constructed ca. 1921, was first owned by Calvin Brewer. The house was vacant, ca. 1926. Maude and G.B. Bare, a partsman with Simpson Motor, were the occupants, ca. 1928. Worth and Lena Williams were the absentee owners, ca. 1930-1942. Renters included a greaser for Central Chevrolet, a printer, a carpenter, a lineman, and a clerk for Moslander's Cigar Store. The owner/occupant, ca. 1946, was Mrs. Susan Hogge, widow of Dave. Kathryn and Robert D. Hogge were listed as the owners in 1947.

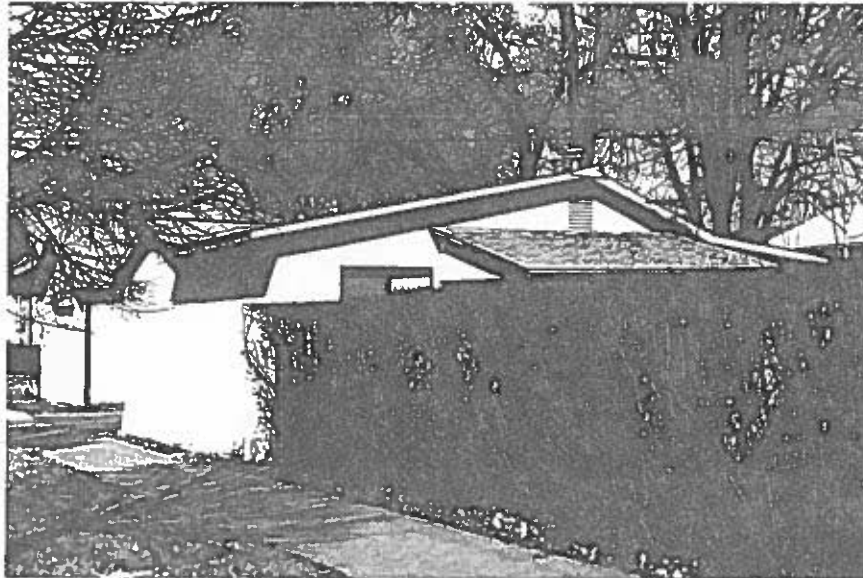
