ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One and a half story with front gable roof. White concrete foundation and porch base overlaid with trellis work painted light blue. Concrete steps covered by long wooden ramp lead to an open porch with hip roof extending across the entire facade. Three full height, Tuscan columns and two responds. Simple wood railing. Front door is flush with three small lights. Wood screen door. One story gable wings extend from the rear and west elevations. Windows around the house are double hung, wood sash, one-over-one. Shed roof dormer on east elevation. Light blue, simple drop siding. Porch columns, porch railing, corner boards, cornices, raking cornices, fascias, window frames and window surrounds are white. Porch column capitals, brackets under porch eave at entrance and porch coping are light blue. Large sunburst pattern in principal pedimented gable has alternating bands of white and light blue. Gray composition roof shingles with boxed eaves. Brick chimney on west slope and on ridge of rear gable wing.

Grass yard with two mature trees along street. Front yard is enclosed by chain-link fence and is dirt with various playground equipment. Rear yard enclosed by tall wood fence.

Single car garage in rear with front gable, cedar shingle roof, and light blue simple drop siding.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): The first owners/occupants were Stella and Christian Lass, ca. 1904-1917, and the absentee owners, ca. 1918-1922. Christian was a master mechanic on the Bookcliff Railroad, and then an engineer. Eva and Albert S. Cain, a printer with the Outing Shop, were the owners/occupants, ca. 1922; and Violet and Edward P. Kennedy, a carpenter, ca. 1923-1924. Lena and Henry A. Eaton, Eaton's Garage, were the owners/occupants, ca. 1925-1928, and the absentee owners, ca. 1929-1930, and 1933-1940. Daisy and Bradford Silas, a traveling salesman, were the owners/occupants, ca. 1931-1932. Renters ca. 1934-1940, included a electrician with Laycock Motors and a barber. Linnie and John S. Brown were the owners/occupants, ca. 1941-1943; and Helen and Thurston Dull, a combination man for Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph, ca. 1945-1949.
