ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with front gable roof. Basement skirted with red shake shingles. Wood steps on the west side of the facade lead to a screened porch with hip roof extending across three-quarters of facade. Red simple drop siding on half-wall extends down to the ground. Four half-height, squared porch posts. Ribbons of wood frame screens on all three sides of porch. Metal screen porch door. Main door is flush with simple diamond light. Windows around house are double hung, wood sash, one-over-one. Wood louvered opening in gable. Red wood shingle siding. Porch posts, window frames and surrounds, corner boards, fascia and raking cornices are white. Red composition shingle roof has boxed eaves. Brick chimney on the east slope.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): The first owner of this house, constructed ca. 1897, is unknown. Anna and Martin C. Peterson, a car inspector at the Union Depot, were the owners/occupants, ca. 1900-1909. After Martin passed away ca. 1909, Anna continued to own/occupy the house until her death in 1917. Grace and Eugene Anderson, a salesman, owned and occupied the house, ca. 1919-1923. Peter S. Murphy is listed as the owner, ca. 1924-1925; and Alice and Guy Murphy, a railroad engineer, as the owners/occupants, ca. 1926-1930. The house then served as a short term rental through 1939. Tenants included a railroad brakeman, a carrier and a shovel operator. Julia and V. LeRoy McCoy, a fireman and then engineer on the Denver and Rio Grande Railway, rented the house ca. 1941-1944, and were the owners/occupants by 1945.


