ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with front gable roof. Concrete basement is painted white. A shallow projecting gabled wing extends across three-quarters of the facade. Carpeted covered concrete steps with wrought iron railings lead to the front door inset into shallow projecting wing. Flush front door with metal storm door. Windows around house are metal frame sliding windows. A large mult window on west elevation. Brown clapboard wood siding. Window frames are brown. Raking cornices and returns are tan. Wrought iron railings are white. Small, double pane basement windows. Gray composition shingle roof with eaves close to the wall. Brick chimney on west slope.


