Summary:

9/3 – Little Park Road – 20 year old male fell from a moving vehicle while climbing from the cab to the bed, DOA at the scene.

9/6 – Uncompahgre National Forest – 6 year old male fell out of a tree, sustained a broken arm and was having a difficulty staying conscious, was transported to St. Mary's by Gateway/Unawep Fire; Potholes - An adult female broke her ankle and people on scene could not get her out of the water, GJ Fire and MCSO responded to assist the female; Butterknife Trail – 61 year old male crashed his bike and dislocated his shoulder, GJ Fire responded, carried him out and transported to St. Mary's.

9/8 – 26 Road & Patterson – Process server was attempting to serve papers, stepped in front of a the subjects vehicle and was hit when the driver took off, the victim was launched on to the hood and roof & his arm got hooked through the window, the driver rolled it up kept driving, driver was taken in to custody.

9/9 – 7th and Grand – 3 vehicle crash temporarily closed down the intersection, one patient was extracted from a vehicle and transported to St. Mary's; 535

Hoover Court – Welfare check on an adult male after employer and ex-wife reported him missing, was found DOA at residence of apparent suicide.

9/13 – Big Creek Campground, Mesa, CO – 14 year old male was shot and killed, presumed hunting accident; 1405 Elm Ave – Felony Menacing – a male called in to report someone was at his residence trying come in and kill him, there were previous code 5 calls at the address for the RP, the RP was later detained after no threats were found and taken to the VA which he fled from and was taken to Mind Springs where he was very uncooperative and eventually ended up at St. Mary's.

9/14 – 2844 Hall Ave – One male was shot in the hip/leg during a fight, suspect(s) left the scene and multiple people were later detained and taken in to custody.

9/15 – 3226 Bunting Ave – one male was shot in the face while standing in his driveway, incident was possibly connected to the previous night's shooting event, patient was taken to St. Mary's; River Front Trail – a male was walking the trail, tripped and was stabbed in the eye with a stick, patient was transported to St. Mary's.

9/17 – 114 Spruce St. – a suspicious package was left near the entrance to the public defender's office, the street was closed down and the BOMB team responded to investigate; 9th and Grand – adult male seen walking, wearing body armor and carrying a handgun in his belt, two subjects were contacted and the incident was safely resolved.

9/19 – Carson Lake area – an adult male was allegedly attacked by a bear while hunting, had a broken ankle and scalp wounds, was taken to Whitewater in a personal vehicle and transported to St. Mary's by Lands End Fire. Upon further investigation by the DOW, there was not a bear in the vicinity and they are not sure what the man actually saw, causing him to crash his ATV while scouting.

9/20 – Rimrock Walmart – felony menacing that started as a verbal disturbance, one male pulled a hatchet and the other subject had a gun, no injuries; DeBeque – north of County Road 207 – two ATV's involved in a head on collision, one rider, a 19 year old male with unknown injuries was transported to St. Mary's and the other rider, a 50 year old male was DOA; 698 Round Hill – Structure fire reported by the homeowner, no injuries.

Training:

- Completed 33 hours of training at the 2015 VAP training academy. Presenters spoke on topics ranging from domestic violence, criminal justice procedures, protection orders, communication skills, trauma intervention, cultural considerations, Victim Rights Act mandates, dynamics of sexual assault, legal resources, grief & bereavement, safety, coroner procedures and death notification. Training was organized (and some topics taught) by both Victim Services coordinators at the GJPD and MCSO.
- Monthly VAP meeting included an introduction to the “Voices” program by representatives from the Western CO Writers Forum, who use the program as a means for therapeutic help.

- Prepared and submitted 2016 VALE grant for VAP mileage and cell phone plan reimbursement
