ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Recreational park on an irregular lot. Graveled parking area off Santa Clara Avenue. From parking, concrete walk leads down to the park. The grounds are a broad glen with a stream along the east/west axis. On the north and south rises are many elm, pine, cedar and fir trees. Along the stream, the lawn is open with clusters of Russian Olive and ash trees and many new trees, including ash, locust and oak. Dry embankment near the highway has yucca and elm trees. Row of new red leaf trees is along the base of the embankment. Many lamps are on tall black metal poles. A wood bridge over the stream on the east end. A childrens' play area, centrally located, has a jungle gym and slide. Octagonal pavilion with a concrete floor is near the stream. Two charcoal grilles. Picnic tables are in the pavilion and around the park. Near the foot of the wall is a white concrete block restroom with an open porch across the south elevation. The park is bounded on the North by Santa Clara Avenue, West by U.S. 6 and 50, South by Unaweep Avenue, and East by Delores Street. HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): This park, originally created by the Mesa County Road Department ca. 1939 when US Highway 50 was put through Orchard Mesa, was deeded to the City by Mesa County on May 2, 1974. The commissioners voted to allocate \$5,000 per year at the time for upkeep. It has improved over the years, creating a place for recreation for not only Orchard Mesa, but for all residents of the area. 
