ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Two story, pyramidal hip roof. Carpet covered concrete steps lead to open porch with hipped roof that extends across the central three-quarters of facade. Narrow lapped siding on half-wall. Four, full height, fluted Tuscan piers. Paneled front door has large single light. Windows around house are double hung, wood sash, one-over-one, with metal frame storm windows. Two large, fixed pane picture windows on east elevation. Small window in upper center of facade with three vertical lights. Wide lapped fiberboard siding is blue on the first floor and white on second floor. Porch half wall, porch piers, front door, window frames and surrounds, comice and fascia are white. Light red composition shingle roof with boxed eaves. Brick chimney on ridge. Concrete foundation painted blue.

Landscaped grass yard with two mature trees next to street. Small tree on east side of lot. Backyard enclosed by tall, wood fence. Two car garage in rear with front gable, light red composition shingle roof, and white, simple drop siding.

Doyle, a salesman with Pacific Fruit and Produce, were the renters in 1932. Della and Eugene Ingraham, a clerk with the Post Office, were the owners/occupants 1925-1941. Tenants by 1946, were owners Elizabeth and Louis Ballinger, a machinist.


