ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One-and-a half story, side gable roof. Concrete foundation. Broad concrete steps, with wrought iron railings, lead to double entrance on the east half of the facade. Both doors are metal frame storms. The door on the right leads to a flight of internal stairs. The door on the left leads to a small, screened porch integral under principal roof. Porch has half-wall with narrow vertical siding and a large, squared, full height corner post. Porch has large, wood framed screens. Porch leads to main door which is paneled and has a large light. Windows around house are double hung, wood sash, one-over-one. Squared bay with shed roof on east elevation. A wide shed roof dormer extending across the entire facade has corner knee braces and two pairs of small sash windows. Yellow simple drop siding. Porch posts and screen frames, door frames, window frames and surrounds, corner boards, barge boards and knee braces are light brown. Brown composition shingle roof with overhanging eaves and knee braces.

Landscaped lawn with two maple saplings next to street. Three young trees along west side of lot. Bushes along facade. Three rose bushes in front yard with park bench. A lamp post with white globe lamps. Front and back yards enclosed by a chain-link fence. Tall, wood fence extends from facade to perimeter chain-link fence.

John Huey, a carpenter, lived there in 1911 and owned the house through 1919. Charlotte and Charles Osgood owned and occupied the house ca. 1921-1930, and Charlotte lived there alone until 1934, but owned the house until 1942. Tenant ca. 1935-1941 was Edwinna Colpitts. Flora and Noel Balley, a janitor, lived there in 1946.
