ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story, hip roof. Rusticated block foundation. Broad concrete steps, with wrought iron railing, on center of facade, lead to sunporch/entry, under principal roof. Porch extends across entire facade. Narrow vertical siding on half-wall and four, full height Tuscan porch piers. Porch glazing consists of four, very large, fixed pane windows around all three side of porch. Wood screen door with glass transom is flanked by two tall narrow lights. Main door is glazed wood frame. Windows around house are double hung, wood sash, one-over-one, with metal frame storm windows. Squared, hipped roof projecting bay on west elevation. Hipped roof dormer on center of facade has wood louvered opening framed by two small, fifteen light windows. White false bevel siding. Window frames and surrounds, porch piers and half-wall, corner boards and fascia are white. Gray composition shingle roof with boxed eaves. Two brick chimneys on ridge.

Landscaped yard with two young trees next to street. Two flowering shrubs next to facade. Row of small bushes and flowers along east side of lot. Mature tree in backyard. Backyard enclosed by chain-link fence with many flowering shrubs.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): Charles Quist was the first owner of this house ca. 1909-1916. The first listed tenant was owner Clarence Eidson, stockman, ca. 1918-1933. Woolgrower Thomas Lepinotes owned and occupied the house ca. 1936-1942, and Christine Lepinotes, widow of Thomas, lived there through at least 1947.
