ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with flat roof. Concrete foundation. Wood steps on east elevation lead to a recessed, paneled door with a light. A small, flat, wood canopy over the door is suspended from the wall by an overhead chain. On the alley side, which is the facade, are two paneled wood doors set deeply in the thick brick walls. On the facade there is evidence that a full width porch or loading dock was there. This has been removed and doors, atop the three foot high foundation, have no steps. Three windows on the facade, and one on the east elevation, are double hung, wood sash, one-over-one. On the west elevation there are three double hung, sash windows, four-over-four. The facade windows and doors have relieving arches. All but the east window have rusticated stone sills. Two facade windows have plywood covers. All other windows have heavy gauge expanded metal mesh grilles. The facade walls are red pressed brick. The other walls are red common brick, laid in American bond. Fading white paint on most of the walls. The flat roof has stepped parapets on the east and west elevations. The facade has an even corbeled parapet. The center fifth is two feet higher. Four pilasters, four feet long are across the parapet. Brick chimney is on the north side of the flat roof.

Recent shed roof one car garage is on the north elevation. Corrugated metal roof and beige corrugated metal walls. The white metal door has three lights with heavy metal mesh screening.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): This building is listed as being built in 1906 but shows up on the tax records as early as 1899. It was owned by Adolph Coors Brewing Company 1907 - 1926. In 1913, it was the home of O. Koshio who operated a billiard parlor at 209 Colorado Avenue. By 1919, the business at 209 was the Eagle Pool Hall, and M. Miyake, the proprietor, lived at 209 1/2 Colorado. The building was home to Thomas Kotoni Hayashi ca. 1924-1932 and he owned the building ca. 1927-1940. Ted and Harry Hayashi are listed at this address ca. 1941 through at least 1946. Wayne Stice was the tenant in 1949, and T. McNulty in 1951. A faded sign on the facade says "Sinclair Oil Co," Indicating early commercial use.


