


ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One and a half story, hip roof with cross gables. Concrete block foundation. Concrete steps. An enclosed wraparound porch with hip roof extends across the facade. Black panel, fiber board sheathing on walls. Pairs of metal frame sliding windows. Door is flush. Porch base is concrete block. Windows around the house are replacement pairs of metal frame sliding windows with narrow wood frames. Siding is green wood shingles. Window frames, frieze and fascias are white. Grey composition shingle roof. Short gabled wing on the facade and a cross gable on the east elevation are pedimented with a kick. Their Palladian windows have been replaced with pairs of metal frame sliding windows. The gable faces have white wood shingles.

Lawn with evergreens across west facade. Three trees are on the lawn.

Shed roof building with white simple drop siding at the rear may have been a garage. It is now enclosed by a basket-weave fence.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): The first owner of this house was M. Vira Segmiller ca. 1902-1906. She was followed by M. J. Moss ca. 1907-1919. The first listed occupants were owners Josephine and George Barton of Barton-Terrill Investments who lived in the house ca. 1920-1926 and continued to own it through 1945. During these years, tenants included a boilermaker. The tenants ca. 1943-1946 were Margaret and Lloyd Wonderley, who was in the Navy.

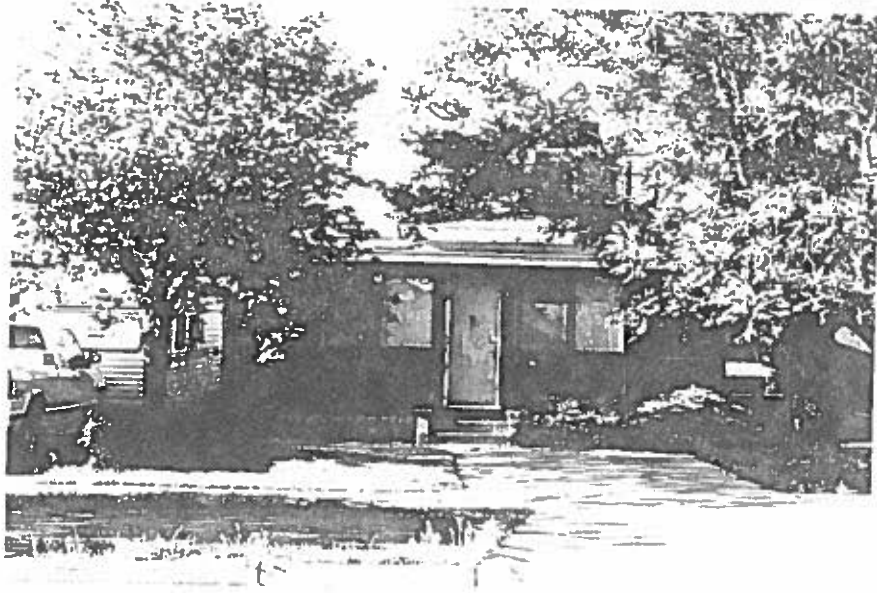
