His daughters, Margaret and Dorothy and Nora Flynn, were the owners, ca. 1939-1943; and Josephine and Herman Hollenbeck, a railroader, the tenants. George Wolf, a teacher, lived there in 1946, and Hilda Besse, widow of Alfred and principal of Lowell School, was the owner.


