ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with hip roof. Foundation skirted with planks grooved like blocks. Concrete steps have rounded corners and are in a diminishing tier of three. Enclosed porch with hip roof extends across most of the facade. White narrow vertical siding on half-wall. Four full height Tuscan columns are across the porch with cushioned capitals and bases. Former screen openings are enclosed with vertical siding. Door in center of porch is paneled and has a large light. Contiguous to the east of the door is a window. This window and windows on the east and west sides of the porch facade are pairs of metal frame, single light sliding windows. Porch door is paneled with a light. Door inside the porch also is paneled with a large light. Windows around the house are double hung, wood sash, one-over-one. Screens have wood frames. Tan simple drop wood siding. Porch window frames, coping and column bases and window screens are black. Gray composition shingle roof. Pedimented cross gable on west facade has a kick. The gable face has tan wood shingles. Exposed rafter ends on hip roof and gable have ornamental sawing. A brick chimney on the south slope, and on the north slope of a hip roof wing.

Thistle ca. 1906-1910, the first listed tenants of this house are owners Josie and George Gordon, ca. 1912-1919. Josie owned the house through 1924, following George's death in 1918. Marie and Michael O'Connor owned and occupied the house ca. 1925-1934. Michael was a clerk for Watson and Son. Nunziato Stranger, along with Carl and Marguerite Stranger, lived in the house 1935-1942. The tenants ca. 1946 were owners Ben and Assunta Ventura, a carman with the Denver and Rio Grande Railway.


