

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One unit of five contiguous buildings. Concrete foundation. Three stories and full basement. Covered concrete loading dock is across the facade. Metal shed roof over the dock is supported by steel "I" beam piers. Two metal, wide rolling doors, and a standard width door, all with relieving arches open to the dock. Second and third story windows on the facade with relieving arches are filled with brick. Brick walls are painted gray on the facade. East end of the loading dock has an enclosing wall which is horizontal planks painted gray. Narrow flight of concrete steps is indented in the center of the dock. Parapet across the facade has a cornice of three courses of brick. Center tenth of the parapet is a foot higher. Brick chimney on roof near parapet. HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): This building was owned by Tillie K. Broemser in 1916. In 1924, the owners were Blackwell and Copeland. The Armour Meat Company was a lessor at the 443 half of the building from 1916 to circa 1935. J.S. Brown Mercantile Company, wholesale grocers, were at 445 from around 1924-1937. By 1937, Safeway and Western States Grocery were in 443-445. It was a grocery warehouse and district office. In 1941, Safeway moved to 437 and 445 was vacant. Circa 1945-1950, the United States Department of Agriculture Soil Conservation Service was in 445. By 1955, Montgomery Ward was in 445, where their warehouse and service center was located until ca. 1975. In 1941, J.W. Milne bought the building and in 1947, Thomas and Alleen Litton purchased the property and remain the owners to date.
