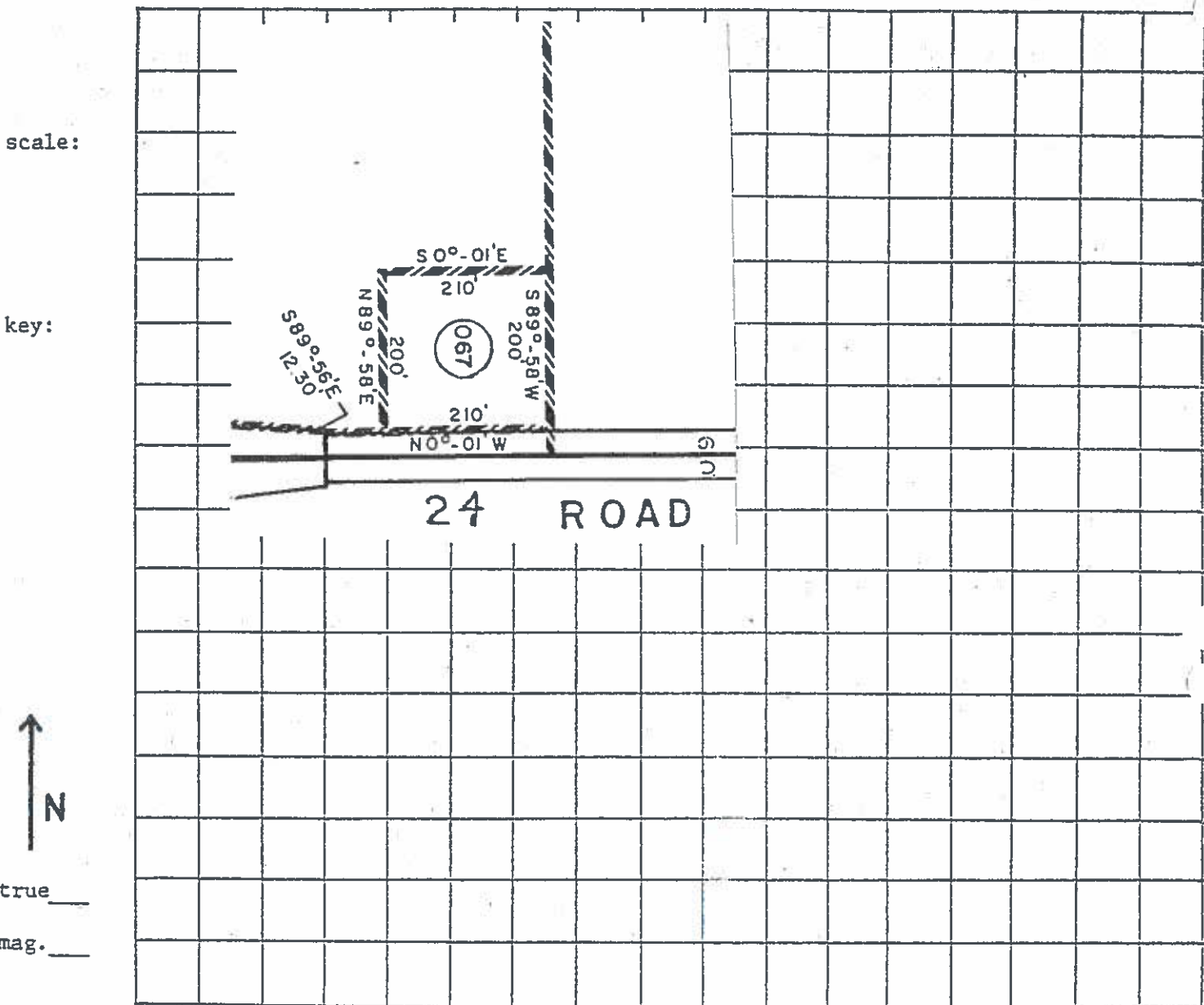

The house was built by Archie and Ema Thrailkill, in 1913. The Thrailkills traveled to California every winter due to the poor health of their son. Mrs. Thrailkill was impressed by the California Spanish farmhouses and she patterned her new house after these. The house is constructed with a lathe base and a stucco finish.

The Thrailkills came to Colorado in 1895. They were originally farmers in Missouri. The family rented an immigrant car to move their family possessions and livestock to the Grand Valley. They purchased 40 acres of land before 1900 at the site of the current residence. They lived in a shabbily constructed house prior to the construction of the stucco residence. The major crops the Thrailkills raised were apples and strawberries.

This mission style farm house possesses a high degree of integrity and is a style very rare in Mesa County.

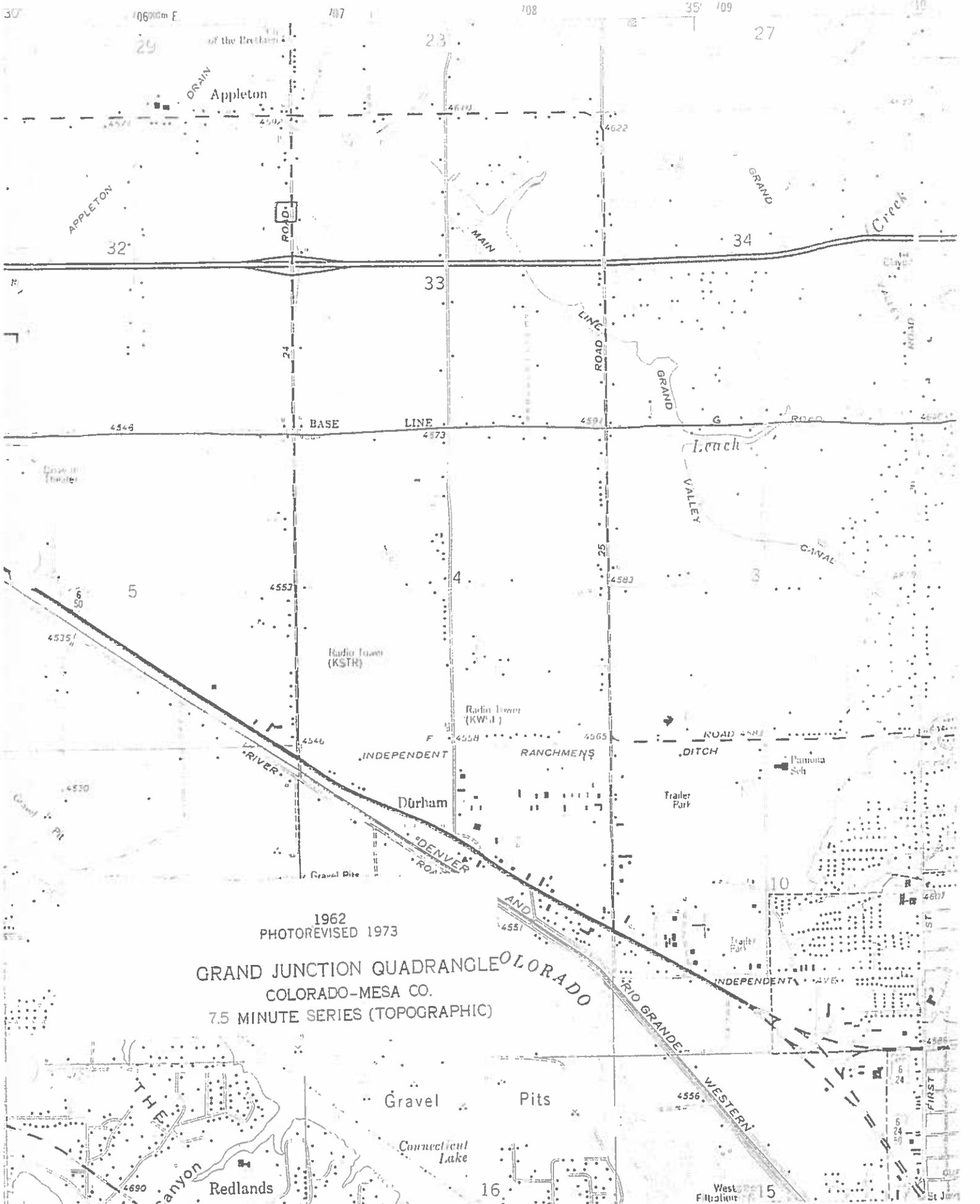
