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Addendum - 337 N. 7th Street, Grand Junction, Colorado

CONSTRUCTION HISTORY:

As Crawford was president of the company, it is not likely that there was a sales price for this parcel. A Sanborn-Perris Map Company map for 1893 shows the completed house on the site. The 1893 footprint is similar to the present house, suggesting there have been no significant additions over the years. Subsequent maps show various outbuildings that have been constructed and demolished over the years. The most recent outbuilding was a 924 sq. ft. garage that was demolished in 1984.

Roessler removed the fireplaces and many of the massive doors when he remodeled into apartments. Mrs. Wilson has some of the entry floor tiles and a box of her father's papers that may relate to the building. Roessler owned it until 1961 or 1962. After that it has been owned by a succession of other investor-owners. It is now mixed commercial/residential use.
