ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One and a half story with front gable. Foundation skirted with siding. Concrete front steps and wrought iron railings lead to sunporch/entry with shed roof integral in east half of facade. The porch also projects 5' with a shed roof over the projection. Siding on half-wall. Squared half-columns on corners of porch. Glazed with ribbons of large lights in metal frames. Storm door. Paneled front door has a light. Windows are double hung wood sash, one-over-one. On second story, a set of triple windows are centered in facade. Cutaway bay on east elevation with gable roof. White asbestos shingle siding. The two lowest courses on foundation are gray. Door and window surrounds, cornices, columns, friezes are apple green. Gray composition shingle roof. Boxed eaves, cornices, raking cornices, return cornices on front and rear gables. Small pedimented gables on east and west slopes. Brick chimney on west slope. Landscaped with iawn, roses, and lilacs around foundation. Saplings in parking area. Wire fence around backyard. Two car garage at rear with front gable, same roof and siding materials as main house, and two wood paneled doors.
