ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with hip roof. White painted concrete foundation has a textured finish. Painted wood steps with lattice-like sides lead up to porch with hip roof on west third of the facade. The porch is integral in the corner, and also projects 4'. Siding on porch half-wall. Latticework on porch base. Squared, 6 x 6, columns on front corners. No screening currently, although there is a frame of 2 x 4 lumber where a screen door was installed. Front door is paneled and has a large light. Windows are double hung wood sash, eleven-over-one. On the east facade is a transom window ten-over-one. Bay on east elevation with pedimented gable roof. White lapped siding. Door and window surrounds, corner boards, water table, friezes, column, brackets and comices are pale gray. Gray composition shingle roof with boxed eaves. Hip roof dormers on west and north slopes with white wood shingle siding. Each has a single window of four and five lights. Dormers, porch and principal roof have boxed eaves, cornices, and ornamental brackets under the eaves on 18" centers.

Landscaped with lawn and large evergreens and lilacs near facade. Large evergreens in parking area.

One car garage with front gable, cedar shingle roof, gray simple drop siding and swinging doors. Alley access.

Susana and Frank Isenminger, a contractor, were the owners/residents ca. 1914-1921. J. A. and Carrie McKenzie were the absentee owners ca. 1922-1943. Renters included Mary and Charles M. Porter, Grand Junction Coca Cola Bottling Company ca. 1928, and again in 1935, two railroaders, Annie, the widow of Archie Craig, and a post office inspector. The owners/occupants ca. 1944-1951 were Tille and Leonard Gillette, a pharmacist for Lende Drug and Gavin's Lincoln Park Pharmacy.
