Krohn, an early Grand Junction resident, was originally listed in the 1906 Colorado State Business Directory as a co-owner of Krohn Brothers (furniture and undertaking). After her husband's death in 1930, Alene operated the mortuary and served as Mesa County Coroner from the mid to late 1930s. The Krohns owned the house from ca. 1915-1933, residing at the address ca. 1910-1913, and 1921-1926. Nellie and Les Kruger, plant chief for Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph, occupied the house ca. 1928-1930, and Marian and Charles Shryock, a bookkeeper for Public Service Company of Colorado, resided in the house ca. 1932.
