ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with side gable. Concrete block foundation. Concrete steps with wood railings lead up to porch with extended shed roof which is across five-sixths of facade. Porch has high, smooth concrete base. Across porch are six piers with siding and squared half columns on top. Wood ribbed balustrades. Front door is paneled, and has a large light. Second door also opens onto porch, and is paneled with a large light. West end of the porch and roof are staggered back to match the stagger in the facade. Windows are double hung wood sash fifteen and twelve over one. Projecting bay on west elevation has a flared shed roof. Tan simple drop siding. Window and door surrounds, barge boards, water table, corner boards, porch and step railings are russet. Gray composition shingle roof with flared eaves. Exposed rafter ends and bargeboards are notched. Knee braces under eaves have ornamental sawing.

Landscaped with lawn, low brick planters across porch facade, and elm trees in east yard. Elm and ash trees in parking area. One car garage with front gable, green composition shingle roof, tan drop siding and batten swinging doors. Alley access.

Carra Parsons was the owner ca. 1910-1916. Augusta and Fred Lattman were the owners ca. 1917-1939, and residents ca. 1918-1934.
