ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Two story with side gables and front wing. Concrete foundation. Concrete steps lead up to enclosed, wraparound porch with hip roof extending across the facade and along the east side of the front wing. Five full height, squared porch columns around porch, although the porch is now enclosed with siding. On the facade are two large single lights. Flush door has a large light and a metal frame storm door. Windows around the house are double hung, wood sash, one-over-one. On the east elevation is a hip roof bay. A small diamond window is also on the east elevation. Buff lapped metal siding. Window and door casings, columns, porch frieze, cornices, gutters and downspouts are brown. Brown composition shingle roof. Boxed eaves have cornices. Brick chimney on ridge. Metal flue on the west wall of the front wing is encased metal siding.

Lawn with flowers on east elevation. Gravel and Tree of Heaven on parking. A chain-link fence is around the backyard.

A shed roof, flush wood siding, storage area in the back yard.

Harriet and Nelson Webster, a radio technician, were the owners/occupants, ca. 1946 to at least 1947.
