## Summary:

**10/3** – North Ave Walmart – a belligerent customer threatened several people and hit a vehicle while driving out of the parking lot, a REDDI was issued, multiple calls came in referencing the same vehicle and the subject was eventually taken in to custody; Colorado National Monument/MM13 – cyclist died during the Tour of the Moon event – unknown at the time if there was a medical condition that caused the crashed or if the patient died as a result of the crash.

**10/7-** A MCSO arrest resulted in one sergeant getting three stitches in his hand and a deputy injuring his knee.

**10/11** – 27 ¼ Road – Search and Rescue called out for a missing 72 year old male, went mountain biking on his own and was not heard from for over a day and a half, patient was found injured and CareFlight transported him to St. Mary's; 27 ¼ Road/Desert - 13 year old male wrecked his dirt bike, transported to St. Mary's with a broken collar bone; Colo National Monument – suicidal subject found sitting on a cliff, rangers were able to talk him down; 1217 Colorado Ave –

suicidal subject was reported to be out of control in his home, subject eventually came out of his house on his own and was taken to St. Mary's Hospital.

**10/17** – 3294 Columba Drive – residence was shot at multiple times, homeowner shot back, there was an earlier altercation between homeowner and possible subject(s), no injuries; 547 Pauline Street – 2 dogs were shot and killed during a neighbor dispute; 505 29 Road – 7 month old female found unconscious and not breathing, CPR was not successful, unknown cause; Amtrak Train Station – train stopped in Grand Junction with a deceased elderly female on board, unknown circumstances; Code 5 subject located at F  $\frac{3}{4}$  and 31  $\frac{1}{2}$  Roads after calling in that his wife and daughter had been killed by the Mexican Mafia, was taken to St. Mary's Hospital; Several calls regarding fraudulent credit card activity at Home Depot.

**10/18** – VA Hospital – male subject arrived at the hospital with a slashed throat, unable to articulate what happened, mumbling a female's name, the subject's residence was determined and the GJPD was sent to investigate; 1250 Bookcliff – male subject was arrested for making threats referencing drugs, ran from the patrol car in handcuffs, was not located; Moon Farm – RP received info 2<sup>nd</sup> hand from a female subject that she was bleeding from unknown injuries, claimed there was a knife lying next to her, the female was believed to be intoxicated or on drugs and was transported to St. Mary's.

**10/24** – Community notification sent out for an 8 year old male that was missing for approximately 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  hours, the child was located safe and uninjured.

**10/25** – Garfield County Dispatch sent an ATL on a stolen vehicle with a GPS pinging in Grand Junction, officers responded and pulled the vehicle over and the driver claimed to be the owner's girlfriend, who was arrested in Utah the day before, the vehicle did not come back as stolen, contacted Garfield County and they indicated their RP was a different female claiming to be the owner's girlfriend, PD officers cleared the call.

**10/26** – 1550 Highway 50 #5 – 21 year old male attempted suicide by hanging, was found unconscious and not breathing, patient was cut down by emergency responders who performed CPR until EMS arrived and transported him to St. Mary's; 625 24  $\frac{1}{2}$  Road – GJ Golf Store – intoxicated male drove his vehicle into the side of the retail store, significant damage to the store but no injuries to the driver; 2625 Mesa Avenue – female was arrested for false DV reporting.

**10/30** – Male showed up to St. Mary's with a gunshot wound to the leg, incident occurred at 3268 E Road, MCSO started investigation.

- 10/16/2015 2015-00189 Complaint that officers were slow to respond to a call at the Homeless Shelter, and gave the impression that they did not care about the incident.
- Employee 1-2 Unfounded/Unsustained
- 10/16/2015 2015-00195 Citizen complained that the officer had numerous mistakes on an accident report.
- Employee 1 Sustained *Several errors were made on the accident report.*
- 10/17/2015 2015-00190 Complaint that she felt the dispatcher who took her animal complaint was rude to her on the phone.
- Employee 1 Unfounded *It was found that the call taker was not rude and in fact was very friendly and offered options throughout the conversation.*
- 10/27/2015 2015-00199 Caller felt she was getting the run-around when she tried to report a burglary and subsequent follow-up reports.

Employee 1-3 Exonerated *Each time the report was delayed, it was either at her suggestion, or with her permission.*

### Excessive Force violation

10/2/2015 2015-00182 Grandmother alleged an officer used excessive force when arresting her grandson.  
Employee 1 Unfounded. Citizen did not have accurate information. Force used was appropriate and necessary.

### Internal commendation

10/3/2015 2015-00179 Citizen contacted the Chief to praise two employees and how they responded to handle a dispute about a semi-truck.

Employee 1-2 Commend employee *They handled this matter with great skill and tact - much appreciate how they dealt with this individual.*

10/10/2015 2015-00181 Employee was commended by the Chief for their management of major parking and traffic issues at the Air Show.

Employee 1 Commend employee *Thanks for the hard work, expertise, and leadership.*

10/24/2015 2015-00193 Employees were commended and thanked by the Chief for their participation in a Tip-A-Cop event.

Employee 1-10 Commend employee *Appreciate your service on this event.*

### Use of force

10/2/2015 2015-00183 Suspect struggled with an officer during a lawful detention and ran after one handcuff was applied. The subject fell, got up, was Tased, fell, got up and was Tased again, falling a third time.

Employee 1 Followed policy *Based on suspect's violent, aggressive resistance, the UOF met policy and training and was objectively reasonable.*

10/3/2015 2015-00175 Subject with warrants fled from officers on foot. After a short foot chase, a Taser was successfully deployed, and the suspect was taken into custody.

Employee 1 Followed policy *Deployment of the Taser was reasonable and justified to prevent the escape.*

10/7/2015 2015-00187 Suspected trespasser became uncooperative then physically resisted being handcuffed. Second officer arrived and she was handcuffed. She complained her wrist was injured while being handcuffed.

Employee 1-2 Followed policy *UOF was reasonable and appropriate.*

10/22/2015 2015-00188 Suspect was physically aggressive toward an officer and attempted to grab the officer's firearm on his duty belt. Officer Tased the suspect with minimal effect. Suspect was taken into custody after more officers arrived to assist.

Employee 1 Followed policy *Officer acted appropriately and his actions were justified.*

10/31/2015 2015-00194 Subject was uncooperative during a lawful detention. He struggled with an officer who attempted to handcuff him. He assaulted the officer and ran from the scene. He was Tased and struck with a baton when he actively resisted attempts to take him into custody.

Employee 3-4 Followed policy *Use of hands on control followed training and policy.*
