Summary:

10/3 – North Ave Walmart – a belligerent customer threatened several people and hit a vehicle while driving out of the parking lot, a REDDI was issued, multiple calls came in referencing the same vehicle and the subject was eventually taken in to custody; Colorado National Monument/MM13 – cyclist died during the Tour of the Moon event – unknown at the time if there was a medical condition that caused the crashed or if the patient died as a result of the crash.

10/7- A MCSO arrest resulted in one sergeant getting three stitches in his hand and a deputy injuring his knee.

10/11 – 27 ¼ Road – Search and Rescue called out for a missing 72 year old male, went mountain biking on his own and was not heard from for over a day and a half, patient was found injured and CareFlight transported him to St. Mary's; 27 ¼ Road/Desert - 13 year old male wrecked his dirt bike, transported to St. Mary's with a broken collar bone; Colo National Monument – suicidal subject found sitting on a cliff, rangers were able to talk him down; 1217 Colorado Ave –

suicidal subject was reported to be out of control in his home, subject eventually came out of his house on his own and was taken to St. Mary's Hospital.

10/17 – 3294 Columba Drive – residence was shot at multiple times, homeowner shot back, there was an earlier altercation between homeowner and possible subject(s), no injuries; 547 Pauline Street – 2 dogs were shot and killed during a neighbor dispute; 505 29 Road – 7 month old female found unconscious and not breathing, CPR was not successful, unknown cause; Amtrak Train Station – train stopped in Grand Junction with a deceased elderly female on board, unknown circumstances; Code 5 subject located at F ¾ and 31 ½ Roads after calling in that

his wife and daughter had been killed by the Mexican Mafia, was taken to St. Mary's Hospital; Several calls regarding fraudulent credit card activity at Home Depot.

10/18 – VA Hospital – male subject arrived at the hospital with a slashed throat, unable to articulate what happened, mumbling a female's name, the subject's residence was determined and the GJPD was sent to investigate; 1250 Bookcliff – male subject was arrested for making threats referencing drugs, ran from the patrol car in handcuffs, was not located; Moon Farm – RP received info 2nd hand from a female subject that she was bleeding from unknown injuries, claimed there was a knife lying next to her, the female was believed to be intoxicated or on drugs and was transported to St. Mary's.

10/24 – Community notification sent out for an 8 year old male that was missing for approximately 2 ½ hours, the child was located safe and uninjured.

10/25 – Garfield County Dispatch sent an ATL on a stolen vehicle with a GPS pinging in Grand Junction, officers responded and pulled the vehicle over and the driver claimed to be the owner's girlfriend, who was arrested in Utah the day before, the vehicle did not come back as stolen, contacted Garfield County and they indicated their RP was a different female claiming to be the owner's girlfriend, PD officers cleared the call.

10/26 – 1550 Highway 50 #5 – 21 year old male attempted suicide by hanging, was found unconscious and not breathing, patient was cut down by emergency responders who performed CPR until EMS arrived and transported him to St. Mary's; 625 24 ½ Road – GJ Golf Store – intoxicated male drove his vehicle into the side of the retail store, significant damage to the store but no injuries to the driver; 2625 Mesa Avenue – female was arrested for false DV reporting. **10/30** – Male showed up to St. Mary's with a gunshot wound to the leg, incident occurred at 3268 E Road, MCSO started investigation.
