Item 1: Meeting Called to Order by Scott McBrayer at 12:02 p.m.

Item 2: Approval of Minutes

Gary Schroen moved to approve the September 3, 2015 Parks and Recreation Advisory Board minutes. Kyle Emert seconded. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Item 3: Whitman Park

Rob Schoeber presented the Board with 5 options for Whitman Park renovations. The options were created at the request of the Vagrancy Committee and are available for Council consideration should they decide to take up the matter. A preferred option has not been designated.

Item 4: Update on Las Colonias Amphitheater

Rob Schoeber shared with the Board two funding options for the Las Colonias Amphitheater project. These models have been shared with Council but not discussed.

Item 5: Update on Westlake Skate Park

Traci Wieland talked with the Board about a minor facelift happening at Westlake Skate Park. A new “street” style amenity is being installed by Grindline and the Parks staff are adding landscaping, trees and benches. Parks staff are also relocating some disc golf tees to lessen the impact between the two user groups. There has been \$5,000 in donations generated for this project.

Item 6: For the Good of the Community

- Canyon View Dog Park Renovations are underway. Staff is extending irrigation and seeding the center section. The two outer sections are still open and available for off leash dog activity.
- We were selected as a level 2 planning grant finalist through the GOCO Inspire Initiative. Staff will be in contact with the GOCO staff in the coming weeks to determine next steps.

- The community continues to desire more opportunities for drop in volleyball. Since gymnasium space is already packed with rentals and existing drop in times, Kyle Emert suggested allowing players to drop in if courts are not being used during league nights.
- Kyle Emert talked to the Board about a “Corporate Challenge” he’s seen in another community. Business sponsor teams in Olympics style competitions for points. At the end of all the events a team is declared the champion.
