Summary-

01/02 – 29 Road and the Desert – three adults and six children were lost, with their vehicle stuck in a ravine, SARC responded to the area and located all subjects; Grand Junction Regional Airport – an airplane with 70 souls on board was rerouted to Grand Junction with an engine out, the plane landed without incident.

01/04 – Clifton City Market – two vehicle crash, Clifton Fire and GJFD transported four critical patients ages 5, 6, 15 and 37.

01/06 – 1014 E Grand Avenue, Fruita – Dispatcher Amanda Conrads helped deliver a healthy baby girl!

01/07 – GJPD was on accident alert for about 8 hours; I-70 MM 57 eastbound – semi rolled over, minor injuries; 540 – 29 Road – a male threatened RP with a knife; 522 Gardner Way – SO responded to a burglary in progress, brought equipment to search an attic where they thought the suspect was hiding; 18th and Gunnison – a bike stopped turned in to a foot pursuit, subject was not located.

01/17 – 2910 Jon Hall – Code 6, barricaded subject, the BearCat, SWAT, IDT and Fruita K-9 responded for the five hour incident, subject was eventually taken in to

custody; Freeway Bowl – reported male with a weapon “hanging out” in front of the building, he was contacted and detained; 1000 Redbud Court – three males came into the residence and pulled a knife on the RP, took several valuables, FPD opened an investigation.

01/21 – 2005 N 13th Street – welfare check resulted in one deceased male; Monument Inn/Room 117 – male found DOA in bathtub; Gateway School was put in Shelter-In-Place before being released for the day when a mountain lion was spotted roaming the area; 29 ½ Road & Orchard Ave. – vehicle versus 10 year old boy, the mother of the child transported him to the hospital with minor injuries; Highway 65 reopened after closing during the overnight for scheduled avalanche control; 1140 Walnut – barricaded subject from a DV call was taken in to custody after a K9 unit responded.

01/22 – Threat to female employees at DHS and Courthouse by a male, upset over custody/divorce issues, multiple locations were checked for the male, no contact made; Lowes – male pulled a pocket knife and threatened a female over driving too fast in the parking lot, the male was not contacted; CMU – male subject punched a female in her face while she was in the restroom and stole her purse.

01/23 – 398 Summer Glen – car was stolen from driveway while it was warming up, that car was dropped at another residence when the subject stole a different car that was warming up...this same pattern continued throughout the morning with three other cars, a sixth car was taken and not immediately recovered; Mesa County Jail – inmate found hanging in their cell, transported C2 to St. Mary’s.

01/25 – 2837 North Avenue #B27/A&W Trailer Park – male threatened a female with a knife, subject refused to come outside, SWAT and negotiator were called out, male eventually came out; 624 Walnut – 37 year old male found unresponsive in a closet, was DOA when law enforcement arrived.

01/26 – 12th & North – vehicle vs. bicycle, patient transported to St. Mary’s with minor injuries; Tope Elementary – school was told to Shelter-In-Place for an out of control student until the parents arrived; 2148 Broadway/Garfield’s Restaurant – smoke was reported, no structure damage, possibly a dish dryer caught on fire; 2872 Hartford – male held a knife to a female’s throat, he was taken in to custody without incident; Baxter Pass – SARC was dispatched to help a lost male that was out searching for two missing dogs, CareFlight assisted with the search and spotted the male from overhead.

01/27 – 1015 N 7th Street/Bray Realty – restrained male showed up at ex-wife’s work, claiming he wanted to list a property, became uncooperative and was taken in to custody; 1302 – 15 Road – male found DOA during a welfare check, he had not been seen for a month; 1489 – 10 Road – suicidal female was upset over a divorce, was also Code 6, she slit both wrists shortly before deputies arrived; Paradise Valley Mobile Park #81 – 70 year old female found by a neighbor, was DOA.

01/28 – 312 S Lake Court – suicidal/homicidal male slit his wrists, ran from the Fruita PD and was tased; Regional Center – out of control male was tased after becoming aggressive with staff and breaking property; 2994 Texas Ave – Code 6 male ran from Street Crimes team, SO assisted with the search, male was not immediately found; Cottonwood Lake #1 – SARC responded after SOS signals were received by an alarm company; Old Powderhorn – SARC called out to look for two males that were dropped off at the top of the mountain and did not make it down; 729 Chipeta #3 – male violated a restraining order, came to the address and stole the female's dog and threatened to kill it, the PD set up an unmarked car and waited for the male to come back, he was arrested; Delta/Mesa County border – SARC called out for a snowmobile crash, male had a heart attack and did not survive; 2680 B ½ Road #20F – report of a verbal/fight, when law enforcement arrived there was a male with blood on his hands with a knife and mace.

01/29 – Juvenile was turned over to his mother after he went from Central High School to the Career Center wearing a bullet proof vest, no weapons were found on his person; 2536 Rimrock Avenue – business in the shopping complex were evacuated on the report of a gas smell, GJFD was unable to find the source and left the scene for Xcel to handle; William Drive/Anna Drive –stolen vehicle out of Rifle was tracked to the area, driver failed to yield on a traffic stop, rolled the vehicle in a ravine north of 34 ½ Road/D Road; MCSO, PPD and CSP were on scene looking for the male, subject was found hiding in the bushes.

01/30 – 28 ½ Road & North Avenue – pedestrian versus vehicle, squad responded C3, multiple VAP's called out; Canyonview Park – male and his dog fell through the ice in the south pond, the dog got out on his own and the male was able to keep his head above water until the GJFD arrived.

01/31 – Old Powderhorn – three snowboarders were lost, SARC called out, ski patrol found them several hours later, no injuries; I-70 MM 49 – Palisade Fire EN41 was rear ended by a Greyhound bus, with 35 passengers on board, while responding to a crash, no injuries reported; Douglas Pass – female driving while in labor, dispatcher Jamie Hutton stayed on the line with her for 35 minutes, healthy baby girl was delivered in the ambulance!
