INTRODUCTION

The City of Grand Junction, Colorado and the public relations firm of KezziahWatkins commissioned Dan Jones & Associates, a full-service public opinion and market research firm located in Salt Lake City, Utah, to conduct and compile a survey of 400 residents.

RESEARCH OBJECTIVES

- Compare current survey results to a similar study conducted in 2002, where appropriate
- Identify what residents like best about living in Grand Junction and what they like least about the area
- Measure residents' concerns about several issues in Grand Junction
- Determine whether residents feel that Grand Junction has a small-town feel, what things give it a small-town feel, and how important it is to maintain it
- Identify respondents' biggest concerns about transportation in Grand Junction
- Measure satisfaction levels with the city's road system and identify what things the city could do to improve it
- Assess the adequacy of affordable housing in Grand Junction
- Determine whether residents are satisfied or dissatisfied with the aesthetic appearance of the city and what things could be done to improve it

PROCEDURES

Dan Jones & Associates developed the questionnaire with direction from Tweed Kezziah of KezziahWatkins and the Grand Junction City Council. To meet the research objectives, 413 Grand Junction residents were interviewed in July 28 - August 5, 2004 during evening hours.

Prior to implementation, the client approved the questionnaire. The survey instrument was thoroughly pretested on individuals selected at random from the sample universe (households in Grand Junction). The client also approved any changes made to the questionnaire as a result of the pretest.

SAMPLE

Dan Jones & Associates utilized a random sampling procedure, giving each household within the sample universe an equal opportunity of being selected for an interview. The margin of error for this survey is $\pm 5.0\%$ for total data and increases for subgroups within the data. Screening techniques were used to fill quotas in the ZIP Code areas and to find younger respondents. Final results were weighted by gender to accurately reflect the population of Grand Junction.

FIELDWORK

Dan Jones & Associates employs professional, experienced interviewers who have worked on numerous surveys to date and proven to be reliable, thorough, and able to develop excellent rapport with respondents. To assure accuracy in reciting the questions and recording the responses, interviewers were carefully briefed by the project director. Both structured and unstructured questions were used to measure intensity of opinions and to assess the perceptions of respondents. Demographic questions were asked to provide opinions of subgroups.

DATA ANALYSIS

The staff of Dan Jones & Associates prepared statistical results. Each question has a response distribution, as well as a series of cross-tabulations which organize responses by demographic groups and allow for detection of differences between opinions of subgroups. SPSS (Statistical Package for Social Science) was used to test the data and to determine if differences in relationships between various populations were real or merely due to chance. Checkmarks highlight statistically significant findings.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Living in Grand Junction

Overall, most residents enjoy living in Grand Junction. Specifically, nine out of ten respondents rate Grand Junction as an excellent (28%), very good (46%), or good (19%) place to live. People tend to say that they give Grand Junction the rating they did because it is a great place to live (12%), it has a small-town feel (11%), good climate and weather (9%), and lived here a long time (9%). Unaided, residents affirm that the things they most like about living in Grand Junction are the climate/weather (21%), scenery/mountains/outdoors (12%), location/convenience (9%), recreational opportunities (9%), and the size of the town (8%). In the 2002 study, climate/weather (29%) and scenery/mountains/outdoors (12%) were also the top two responses. Some of the things that residents like least about living in Grand Junction include: traffic (13%), weather (10%), population growth (9%), low wages (9%), and politics/bureaucracy (7%). In the 2002 survey, traffic (23%) and weather (13%) were also the top two responses.

Issues Facing Grand Junction

According to residents, the most important issue facing Grand Junction today is growth (32%), traffic (10%), and water/drought (8%). In 2002, nearly one-half of respondents (49%) mentioned growth as the most important issue facing Grand Junction, noticeably higher than the 32% recorded in 2004. Respondents indicate that they are very concerned about the transient population in Grand Junction (5.22), population growth (5.15), the local economy (5.07), indicated by mean scores above five on a 1-7 scale where one is *not at all concerned* and seven is *very concerned*. Residents are moderately concerned about a safe and healthy environment for youth (4.82), affordable housing (4.81), agricultural lands (4.60), open spaces (4.45), physical appearance of Grand Junction (4.42), a small-town atmosphere (4.33), the transportation system (4.25), and air quality (4.11), indicated by mean scores between four and five on the 1-7 scale. In comparison, respondents are not quite as concerned about culture and arts (3.96), neighborhood parks (3.75), and neighborhoods in general

(3.64), given the mean scores between three and four on the 1-7 scale. Interestingly, residents are not nearly as concerned about most issues as they were in 2002, although some of this could be explained by the change in completed interviews by ZIP Code (refer to Question 1 in Appendix A). The only area where they appear to be more concerned is with the transient population in Grand Junction.

The Youth of Grand Junction

Residents indicate that they would like to see the Youth Council work on more activities for kids (14%), a recreation or activity center (8%), sports activities (7%), and drug/alcohol prevention (6%). Four in five respondents (81%) declare that they would definitely or probably like to see more youth programs or activities implemented in Grand Junction, with responses leaning toward *definitely*. Some of the things that people would like to see implemented include: more activities (14%), more sports or outdoor programs (14%), a recreation center (14%), education programs such as art and drama (7%), and a safe place for kids to go (6%).

Keeping the Small-Town Feel in Grand Junction

There continues to be a consensus among 64% of residents that Grand Junction has a small-town feel. Respondents tend to say that Grand Junction has a small-town feel because of good/friendly people (20%), Main Street and downtown (16%), knowing people (15%), events (7%), and population (7%). Among those who feel that Grand Junction does not have a small-town feel, they say that the growth/population (35%), traffic (29%), and commercial building (6%) detract from it. Four in five residents (81%) confirm that it is very important or somewhat important to them that Grand Junction has that small-town character, up eight percentage points in the past two years.

Other Important Issues in Grand Junction

Economy. Similar to 2002 findings, a slim majority of residents (51%) rate the overall economy of Grand Junction as excellent or good, with responses leaning toward *good*. One-third of those interviewed (35%) continue to describe the economy of Grand

Junction as fair, while 11% maintain that it is poor. As might be expected, a high percentage of people (92%) think that the City of Grand Junction should definitely or probably work to promote better paying jobs in Grand Junction, with responses leaning heavily toward *definitely*.

Transportation. Residents report that they are most concerned about traffic (20%), public transportation (16%), congestion (7%), and inadequate roads (7%) – many of the same transportation concerns that were expressed in 2002. When asked to rate Grand Junction on the pedestrian system, bus system, and bicycle system, residents give the city its highest ratings for the pedestrian system (sidewalks and walking paths). Specifically, three-fourths of respondents (75%) rate the pedestrian system in Grand Junction as good or excellent, with responses leaning toward *good*. Slightly less than one-half of those interviewed rate the bus system (49%) and bicycle system (46%) as good or excellent; once again, responses lean toward *good*. It is important to keep in mind that one-fourth of respondents acknowledge that they don't know how they would rate the bus system. Compared to 2002, ratings have improved considerably for the pedestrian system while dropping slightly for the bus system and bicycle system.


Two-thirds of those polled (67%) confirm that they are very satisfied or somewhat satisfied with the road system in Grand Junction, up nine percentage points in the past two years. When asked for suggestions of what the city could do to improve transportation for the future, respondents suggest better planning (10%), build more roads (9%), improve the bus system (8%), limit road construction (7%), and widen roads (6%). A significant percentage of residents (18%) admit that they don't know how the city could improve future transportation.

Housing. Residents are divided over whether or not there is adequate affordable housing in Grand Junction. Less than one-half of those interviewed (46%) claim that there definitely is not or probably is not enough affordable housing in Grand Junction. Slightly fewer people (44%) think that there is definitely or probably adequate affordable housing in Grand Junction. Two years ago, a noticeably higher percentage of people felt that Grand Junction had enough affordable housing (54%) compared to those who believe there was not (37%). As might be expected, a high percentage of

residents (78%) think that the City of Grand Junction should work to promote affordable housing for the citizens of Grand Junction. Nearly three-fourths of respondents (72%) declare that the City of Grand Junction should definitely or probably develop programs to assist its neighborhoods. The types of programs that residents would like to see developed include: Neighborhood Watch (15%), low-income housing (8%), as well as clean-ups and weed control (8%). Three in ten respondents (29%) acknowledge that they don't know what types of programs should be developed that would allow Grand Junction to assist its neighborhoods.


Improving the Appearance of the City


Four in five residents (82%) declare that they are very satisfied or somewhat satisfied with the aesthetic appearance of the city, similar to the percentage that said the same thing in 2002. It is worth mentioning the increase among those who are very satisfied with the aesthetic appearance, increasing from 20% in 2002 to 27% in 2004. On the other hand, one in six people (16%) maintain that they are very dissatisfied or somewhat dissatisfied with the aesthetic appearance of Grand Junction, changing little since the last survey. Some of the suggestions that residents give to improve the appearance of the city include: landscaping (10%), keep the city clean (7%), and improve the entrance to the city (6%).


Question 2. How would you rate Grand Junction as a place to live?



Question 3. Why do you rate Grand Junction that way? (Top responses listed)



Question 4. What do you like most about living in Grand Junction? (Top responses listed)





Question 5. What do you like least about living in Grand Junction? (Top responses listed)





Question 6. What would you consider to be the most important issue facing Grand Junction today? (Top responses listed)










Question 22. How would you describe the "ideal" neighborhood - that is - what things would make it good? (Top responses listed)





Question 23. The City of Grand Junction has recently formed a Youth Council. What activities, issues, or projects would you like to see them working on? (Top responses listed)




Question 24. Would you like to see more youth programs or activities implemented in Grand Junction?



Question 25. IF YES: What would you like to see implemented? (N=332, top responses listed)



Question 26. In your opinion, does Grand Junction have a small-town feel?



Question 27. IF DEFINITELY / PROBABLY: What kinds of things give it that feel? (Top responses listed)





Question 28. IF DEFINITELY NOT / PROBABLY NOT: What kinds of things detract from it? (N=99, top responses listed)





Question 29. As Grand Junction grows, it will be increasingly difficult to maintain a small-town feel and character. How important is it to you that Grand Junction has that small-town character?




**Question 30. How would you rate the overall economy of Grand Junction?

Question 31. In your opinion, should the City of Grand Junction work to promote better paying jobs in Grand Junction?





Question 32. What concerns you the most about transportation in Grand Junction? (Top responses listed)





Question 33. How would you rate Grand Junction on its pedestrian system (sidewalks and walking paths)?




Question 35. How would you rate Grand Junction on its bicycle system?

Question 36. Overall, how satisfied are you with the road system in Grand Junction?





Question 37. What specific things could the City do to improve transportation for the future? (Top responses listed)





Question 38. In your opinion, is there adequate affordable housing in Grand Junction?





Question 39. Should the City of Grand Junction work to promote affordable housing for the citizens of Grand Junction?





Question 40. Should the City of Grand Junction develop programs to assist its neighborhoods?





Question 41. IF DEFINITELY / PROBABLY: What types of programs should be developed? (N=298, top responses listed)



I would like them to spread out the construction instead of closing three of four intersections at one time.

I would like to see more of the public transportation go to the outlying areas.

I would say perhaps our traffic load is exceeding some of the street capacities.

I would say the traffic's just too heavy. They need to alleviate the traffic.

I'd like to know why we don't have any air service or train service to Los Angeles.

I'm handicapped and just getting around.

I-70 business loop and the F-Road. Traffic.

Incompetence on the government level. There have been a lot of stupid moves made. Made a lot of infrastructure moves to help flow but there is no straight north or south thoroughfare. They totally jacked up the one that they had to appease the college here. Anytime there is an established road system, they have made changes because some vocal minority has cried.

Increased traffic. (2)

I think on the major streets, the ones that run north and west, they need to have right hand turn lanes. They need to widen some of the streets. On the side streets they have them but not on the busy ones.

I think that probably they could set up a system where the people on bicycles could ride on those and then give pedestrians the right of way if needed. Bikes don't stay on the bicycle path.

I think they are doing all they can do.

I think they are doing it. It is just hard to get around right now.

I think they could look at the roads in a manner of what is going to be needed in ten years. They need to think ahead more than they are now and not just meeting the needs of the moment. They need to plan. It is going to be a little mini Denver. Highway control. Get across town quickly.

I think they need at least one more east-west corridor. At least one more north south corridor.

I think they're doing it. They are getting the traffic out of downtown.

I think they're just going to have to expand. Not all at once but just as the population grows.

I think to continue to expand the bus service so that it is available for people all the time.

I think we need to get the bicycles off of the major throughways. They should have to take alternate routes because it is dangerous.

I think we need to simplify it and not put in complicated things like roundabouts. More roads. Better control of what we have with better traffic light systems instead of people going one way wait four minutes. Might have a balance. Larger cities have smart lights.

I would like to see the bicycles restricted more. I like one-way streets and I like roundabouts.

Relieve traffic congestion.

If they made infrastructure of public transit more easily accessible, people wouldn't use cars so much for errands. Hopping on the public system just takes too long.

If they want to work on the roads, they should do it at night. They should widen some roads and look to the future instead of trying to hold onto their small town. The turning lanes are sadly lacking on almost every road.

Improve a north to south corridor in the city.

Improve on the streets.

Improve the road system. More lanes for cars.

Improve the stoplights and have them better timed. They need wider streets.

Improve the traffic flow on Patterson Road.

Improve their public transportation systems.

Improve traffic conditions. (2)

Increase bike paths and park on First Street.

Increase signage, increased turning lanes that would facilitate the flow of traffic. Alternative routes to major business complexes.

Install more stoplights by the mall.

It can get some laws down to help people instead of creating havoc. Just some laws.

It could stop trying to kill the downtown area and tearing areas up and putting in stupid roundabouts. It could get rid of the rule that says they cannot have stoplights from a certain distance.

It might be better to try to improve entrance and exits to the mall area. That's where all the traffic seems to be.

It needs to build more underpasses under the railroad tracks They have only built one. Bridges on Orchard Mesa.

It would be nice if there were a way to get from the middle of the town to Orchard Mesa without having to go around the whole city.

It would come down to better traffic control of streets, highways or main arteries.

It's taken too long. At the end of the day it takes too long to get through stoplights. Too much traffic.

Widen some of the roads.

Just be a little bit faster in expanding the roadways where we're growing. Some don't have shoulders or sidewalks. It's dangerous for cars also because of the gravel on the side.

Just get the work on these damn roads.

Just getting new ways to getting a lot of people to different places.

Just keep the roadwork escalating with the population. Add more roads and do what is necessary to control traffic. We are not going to stop people coming here.

Just maybe paying attention to high traffic areas and situate the lights.

Just provide more streets. More options and more routes to take.

Just the big thing would be keeping an eye on how they route the busy streets. If we can have some major thoroughfares, that take some of the load off the busy streets.

Keep growth in mind and increase in the efficiency of the construction crews.

Keep the roads in good repair.

Keep up the transit improvement where needed. Streets could be kept up better. When they fix the road, they are tearing it up six months later and doing it on all the major roads at once.

Keep up with the building of the roads that move the people.

Learn that we're becoming a larger city.

Less traffic.

Letting people know about mass transit and the bus system. Put a little more money into it and get the interest. Advertise it and make it more available.

Like I mentioned earlier, we've put ourselves in a box. We don't have the ability to make the main arteries larger. We've done a real lousy job and these circumstances are getting worse, like in Patterson. We've got more restaurants. We've done a lousy job and we're not in the process of fixing these things only when they're unmanageable.

Look at growth patterns in Fruita. Moving people from Fruita downtown.

Major arties need to be widened. They need a better bike path to get over the river with the congestion. They need to get some money to extend highway fixing.

Make more cross-town routes.

Make more lanes.

Make more through-streets. Get the construction done. Have more linkage between thoroughfares.

Make quicker repairs on the roads. Shorter timetables for large projects.

Make separate bypass away from traffic. License bikes, pull them over when they break laws.

Making alternate routes or bypasses.

Making decisions. Some of the planning they've done are steps in the right direction.

Making sure that as they get more roads. Keep the lights were the need them.

Mass transit.

More routes in Orchard Mesa to town.

More stop lights. Road bumps to control speed. I like roundabouts.

More traffic lights.

More ways to get in and out of Grand Junction.

Need to look at different traffic flows and come up with different alternative routes.

Need to make more roads. Connect 12th Street to the interstate. Also, 7th Street.

New roads going to different areas.

Not as much construction going on all the time. (2)

Make it so people aren't so cramped together.

Not to work on two main streets that people use to get to work at the same time. Quicker access to the outskirts areas.

One is to add some bus routes to cover more of the town. Quit wasting their money on roundabouts. Put in stoplights and enforce the laws as far as stop signs go.

Our streets are not built wide enough for the buses to be as wide as they are.

Parkway will help.

Pave some of the roads that they have not done yet. Finish the ones that they have been working on for two years. Make downtown a mall or something that would close it off. People can't drive there.

Take the high bypass and make another one. It's unusable.

Teach the people with disabilities how to get around. What's available and how to use it.

Question 37: What specific things could the city do to improve transportation for the future?

That's tough. Some places it seems like if they increase road size, they'll get more traffic and that isn't good for some neighborhoods. Do something about traffic congestion. Some intersections could be safer: Orchard Mesa for example, when you're headed west on B1/2 and merge to Highway 50. It's an odd intersection because cars heading south on 50 can turn left and cross your path while you try to merge north. You have to be careful

The buses to properly exit and enter in to the city streets. More roads and better roads for people on bikes.

The manhole covers. You have to zigzag to miss them! Put them in the middle so we can straddle them or smooth them out

The Parkway loop. Some north/south fast transportation.

The problem is not having enough roads. There are too many dead end areas when you get into the residential sections.

The Redland Parkway would be good to get traffic going. Alternatives to the I-70 system.

The road construction at random places and times of day makes it difficult to get to work because you have to find continually new routes.

The road system could be a little better because there are certain roads bombarded with traffic. Nice to have another alternative route to get from one end of town to the other.

The roads are numbered so it can be very confusing.

There doesn't seem to be very many turn lanes. It's hard to get on and off streets.

There are some intersections that need a lot of help, 1st and Grand. More hours and stops for the busses.

They are just constantly digging something up. Can't hardly go anywhere without taking a detour.

There's only a couple places you can cross the river.

There is always construction. Fix the roads.

They have to look at what they're building as far as communities. They have to look at the size of the community and the size of the roads so they match. Maintain slow speed limits in residential areas.

They are addressing it by the River Front project. The northern traffic corridor needs to be improved.

They are doing a great deal at improving the roads but they do several at the same time. I think if they do one at one place and then another one at another place, it would be better.

They are doing a lot of construction. They are doing things on-time but there are some roads that need repaving .

They are doing some of those things. Working on roadways.

They are going to have to create better routes to link other places. They do need to build another bridge or two across the river.

They are going to have to have a mass transit system at some point.

They are making a good effort at it right know.

They are starting to reroute heavy traffic. They should continue.

They drag things. The small businesses are dying out. There is no one working out there. A lot of equipment. Don't do things on a timely basis. They drag it on and on. Their "Chip Seal" program is a waste of money. Hate the system because it is a waste of time and money.

They have a lot of future plans that they are already working on.

They have to anticipate growth and traffic patterns so there's not gridlocks.

They have to build more major routes to get around.

They have to look at 25th and 1/2 Road and Patterson. It's a high-risk intersection. Certain roads need to be widened and made safer, particularly around schools.

They just need to plan for more traffic. Widening the roads and easier access to outlying community.

They need alternate routes to get traffic around.

They need more public transportation so people can get to any place they want to go by public transport.

They need more roads.

They need to accommodate the growth of Grand Junction.

They need to clean up that congestion on the corridor and I-70. They could maybe become a main east-west road.

They need to continue to work on the 29 Street Bridge Plan. More bridges from Orchard Mesa into town. Construction is everywhere in my neighborhood. That is my biggest gripe.

They need to do something to improve the flow of traffic.

Who they have aren't getting it done. It's crazy. The city street workers are too complacent. Don't want to work.

People aren't interested in neighborhood watch things. Have police cruise local neighborhoods to make their presence shown. Have yards and property kept up so they don't become an eyesore to the neighborhood.

Police on the streets and in the neighborhoods.

Police patrol.

Programs for people to afford rent.

Programs that clean up neighborhoods.

Programs that first-time homeowners have some options.

Programs that help single people find houses.

Programs to give people incentives to get together with their neighbors to establish more friendly neighbors.

Programs where everybody helps everybody.

Putting basketball courts in the parks. Recreation. Policing.

Right now we shouldn't be cutting out programs. That's a state and local situation. Some of the services to the homeless, churches are working on that and the city. We can be stronger on that. I think our services to youth in trouble should be improved. Some of the work we're doing like I-70 and the railroad. The homeless people gather in this town and whether we like it or not. Safety is number one. To make sure everyone is safe where they live. Have sidewalks and parks. More than anything people to be safe and no crime.

Section 8 Housing. We need more of those types of housing units. (2)

Something to lower the rent in this town. The wages aren't that good and the rent is too high.

Some kind of mortgage assistance as opposed to low-cost housing.

The neighborhood watch and beautification. We need to help people with their trees. It is very hard to keep them looking nice. It is getting out of control. People cannot afford to trim their trees.

The neighborhood watch program and Beat Officer Program are great.

The neighborhood watch should be promoted a whole lot more than it is. Safe places for kids to play.

The neighborhood watch is good but I don't think we have one in mine. More information on how to get a neighborhood watch started because I don't hear anything about that. Maybe have something more done about peoples' garbage in their yards. We have someone in the back that has a nasty looking and stinky pile of compost.

The should have more help for senior citizens so they can have an adequate living. Help with utilities because they are on a fixed budget. Help with getting poor families into housing and get everyone stabilized.

The spring clean up for outside the city limits is good. More communication with outlying areas about information that the city doing. Roadwork and building information. More communication.

The weeds not to be too tall. Clean up the yards.

There should be more Habitat Housing.

There are a lot of weeds. There are a lot of houses that need painting.

What I envision is to make affordable housing that is not cheap. Do not let them build inexpensive housing to build and buy that wear out quickly.

Working with the communities in order to better the relationship between the city and its residents.

Youth programs and safe streets.

Youth programs and neighborhood watch.

They could start by getting rid of the garbage and the junk that is strewed around. A lot of the streets looks like a junk pile. Coming down from the interstate on the 24 Road it could look better. They're not aware or they are negligent. It could be much better.

They could take care of the homeless population within the law.

They do pretty good at landscaping, building and street lighting. I like the appearance.

They need to fix something by the 5th Street Bridge area.

They need to get rid of the transient population.

They need to go in and clean up the older parts of town instead of letting them go to hell like they do. They need to look at development property. It's fine to see many trees in the front of a development but we should look into more Xeriscaping. We should not have mini parks that suck up the water.

They need to maintain the parks.

They need to put in a law on the appearance of homes. There are too many old cars sitting in driveways.

They need to review other cities and see what they have done to improve . Find out what the costs are and go that route. For downtown they could use more ornate-type lighting for street lamps, instead of just what is on the market in order to dress up the city. Maybe plant a few more trees here and there.

They should add sidewalks and plant as many trees as possible.

They should be fair with all the communities. It should be throughout. It shouldn't matter what your income is, what the housing income or how many children.

They should build better houses.

They should get rid of the junkyard by the bridge and all the transients.

They should work on North Avenue and somehow widen it. It is junky looking. Work with the utilities on getting more underground telephone polls and wires.

They're pretty much on track. The road system is one thing. Improve it.

They've got a weed ordinance that they do not enforce.

Upkeep on the rental housing. The weeds are growing in the yards.

Walking streets. I would like to see them block off Main Street and make it a walking street. Maintain parks and keep them green.

We could have more parks. It would look nice with trees and grass. The Avalon downtown, that was a good thing they did there.

We need to continue taking care of weed control and empty lots. Enforce unused vehicles and getting them off the streets.

We run into a lot of zoning problems. It doesn't design very good retail marketplace.

Weed control of city or county owned properties.

Weed control and making sure people are not allowed to keep junk around their property.

Weed control. (4)

Well, I think that they are already attempting to make up a new parkway. Better accessibility to the outlying areas.

Well, right now it would look better if we could do something with our traffic problem. If we did a better job with our zoning, we'd be a little bit better off. A little more planning with our zoning. It would improve the appearance. The traffic makes us look bad.

Well, they do need signage for tourists that don't know where the city is. They're doing a pretty good job with it.

When you are coming in on I-70 from Utah, it is one of the worse sections of Grand Junction. Cleaning up the junk.

Work on the entrance to the city.

Work on the roads. I don't like the new symbol for the city. It makes us look like a bunch of hicks. Promote the outdoors. We have it all- mountains and water.

Zoning. They need more zoning of agriculture. No more tall buildings or sprawling malls.
