Background:

An evaluation to determine the appropriate posted speed for the Fall Valley Subdivision was conducted on August 28, 2000. That evaluation was performed in accordance with and pursuant to Article IV, Sections 4-2 and 4-3 of the 1977 Model Traffic Code, section 2B-10 of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Devices and the *City of Grand Junction Speed Evaluation Standards*. The evaluation was reviewed by the Transportation Engineer and in her opinion is consistent with conscientious, reasonable and prudent traffic engineering standards and practices.

Findings:

All streets in the Fall Valley Subdivision are Local. Field investigation was performed and on 8/28/00 and area is found to be residential with winding streets throughout.

Speed Regulation:

Fall Valley Subdivision Shall be posted 20 m.p.h. at both entrances off of 25 ½ Road.
Fall Valley Avenue east of 25 ½ Road and Forest Hills Avenue east of 25 ½ Rd.
