Summary-

2/1 – CSP, GJPD, FPD and PPD on accident alert; School Dist 51 and CMU snow day; VA Hospital – a male subject called the crisis line and indicated he was very upset and on his way to the address with a gun, no incident occurred; 754 Continental Court - 50yom found DOA, PD investigating; Numerous snow related crashes and vehicles sliding off the road.

2/2 – Deported felon was detained during an SO traffic stop; 9th and Grand - -rollover crash involving 2 vehicles, minor injuries and east bound Grand was temporarily shut down; 2473 Payton Ct – AUTOI – Red, Chevy Cavalier was stolen while puffing, inside the car was the owners Taurus .380 handgun and wallet; A white flatbed truck from a previous AUTOI incident was located abandoned in the area of 736 Canvasback #A.

2/4 – CNM MM 19 – Female lost control of vehicle and drove off a 40 ft. ravine, she was not injured, vehicle was recovered; 25 Road/Desert - recovery of a stolen vehicle from last week; 3226 E ½ Road - Semi truck hit a power pole, knocked some power cables down; North Avenue Walmart – FIGHT – a male and a female were arrested with the male having 3 warrants; 2876 Orchard Avenue - SO responded to a barricaded subject (Dustin Nunn) with warrants, they used gas, male was high on meth and heavily armed in the upstairs of a two story apartment, event lasted 8 ½ hours before taking the male into custody after tearing out numerous walls in the entire complex.

2/7 – 601 Silver Plume – COR – 85 year old male, LVFD and FPD performed CPR and got patient back in the ambulance, patient was taken to St. Mary's; MEDTRA transport from Colorado Canyons to St. Mary's for female in labor, 35 weeks, delivered healthy baby en route in the ambulance; 814 Mazatlán – RSTRUC - pellet stove fire, no damage to the residence; Bronco's won the Superbowl – several assaults, fights, removes, parties and fireworks calls, only lasted about an hour.

2/8 – 508 Fruitvale Ct – RP reported a male walking past his office holding a gun, watched the male walk across the highway to the railroad tracks, subject was contacted by SO, altercation occurred with the deputy tasing the male, the subject then fired multiple shots at the deputy, subject fled on foot and was located in a residential backyard in a nearby neighborhood where he was taken in to custody, SO deputy did not survive his injuries;

2/14 – Prospector Motel - weapons violation – male standing outside the motel threatening a male inside holding a shotgun, officers responded as it was reported shots fired, SWAT and IDT responded, subject was contacted and released on a summons hours later; St. Mary's Hospital Parking Lot – during a traffic stop officers called out for backup when a weapon was found in the glove box, concluded with no incident; At the same time a male subject was reported acting strange, carrying a gun and flipping people off, Officers called 1 at gunpoint and the subject was taken into custody; Also occurred during the same time frame - two male subjects were walking in the area of 8th and Gunnison wearing black masks, carrying several knives, Officers responded and after a search discovered the juveniles had fake guns are were released.

2/15 - I70 / Mile Marker 49 - Rockslide - One vehicle was hit a large boulder, both east bound lanes were closed for quite a while.

2/16 - Gas leak on CMU campus, Garfield dorms were evacuated, Xcel was able to get the leak capped off and students were allowed back in to their rooms that night.

2/17 – 25 ½ Road and Patterson/Independent Ave – Five businesses reported that their front door glass had been smashed out during the night; 2601 Belford Avenue – FELMEN – a male with a samurai sword was threatening to chop people up, he was located in one of the apartments and taken in to custody; 3084 Aberdeen Lane – VERB – a male broke the mirrors on a vehicle with a sledgehammer then barricaded himself in the house for a brief period, was eventually arrested; 131 N Bower #4 - BURGI - an ex-boyfriend of the RP kicked in the door of the residence, the subject left, was located a couple of trailers down from the incident and taken in to custody; Area of True Value on Highway 50 – WEAPON - male seen taking a handgun out of his waistband and putting it in his backpack, three schools in the area were put on lock down, the male was contacted without incident, subject had multiple warrants and was taken to jail. 2/18 – Crash at 5th/South Avenue - a female was impaled with a metal fence post that went through her right shoulder area and was poking out the back of her shoulder (not breaking the skin) which caused severe bleeding, the post was still attached to the fence outside the car by about 15 feet and jaws were used to cut the post, patient was transported to St. Mary's; 10506 48-1/4 Road – Structure Fire - House and surrounding trees on fire, unknown cause, everyone evacuated without injury; Thunderstruck Valley – belligerent male was removed, proceeded to call dispatch multiple times because he was angry and "didn't know why he got kicked out", he kept calling, was finally contacted and brought to the PD, ticketed then released...then called dispatch again from the parking lot, started banging on front doors and was contacted a second time, remained belligerent and was consequently arrested.

2/19 – R5 High School – juvenile male threatened to buy a gun and shoot his stepdad, subject was also Code 6, East Middle School was put in shelter in place, the male was contacted without

incident; Multiple crashes - J Rd and $19 \frac{1}{2}$ - rollover, I70 mm 7 - a vehicle slid off into median, two vehicles at I70B and 30 Rd - one in the ditch and one in the median; TJ Maxx - male subject with a fire ax, asked a store employee to hold it for him while he shopped and then he picked it up on the way out.

2/20 – 451 Foy RD – SO responded to a welfare check referencing info obtained via third party from no longer runaway Samantha Mendenhall that there was a female chained up at the residence, a deputy found the female chained up, owner of the residence/kidnapping suspect had an extensive criminal history, suspect was taken in to custody without incident, female was also taken to the SO for further investigation.

2/21 – I70 MM 2, Rollover crash, one adult male with compound ankle fracture, one adult female and a 6 year old male, all taken C2 to St. Mary's.

2/22 - I70 MM 57 rollover, one patient transported C2 to St. Mary's; 572 Cindy Ann – RESTI/Barricade – female taken into custody, after a short time, without incident by GJPD 2/23 – 524 ½ Campbell Way – male suspect fired shots inside the residence with his girlfriend and child in the house, the fem got the gun away from the male and he left to another family members home at 2522 Van Buren Ave, Caprock & WCCC were put into shelter in place and the male was taken into custody without incident; 893 23 Road - Suicidal male was chased and held at gun point, he was detained and taken to St. Mary's without incident; A male subject stole a pair of shoes from Shoe Carnival, left in a vehicle, was eventually boxed in by officers and took off over a fence at 412 Grand Ave, the vehicle he was in was a stolen vehicle.

2/24 – 1345 Mesa Ave – RESTI – RP's ex-boyfriend was peeping in the window, the male was restrained from the address, where the ex-girlfriend lives, same male was reported as causing issues on CMU campus, he was contacted and taken into custody outside of Garfield Hall; Male contacted on a warrant at Day Reporting, he was not cooperative and had to be tased, was taken into custody; Area of Kennedy and 13th Street - CSTRUC – small weed fire on the side of the building on CMU's campus, the fire was out before units arrived; 2878 Texas Avenue – a furnace exploded, burning a male in the face and arm; Horizon Drive/Wendy's - Female was claiming to have been being held against her will in the back of a U-Haul truck, subjects were contacted but no one was taken into custody.

2/25 – 2656 Little Bookcliff Drive #207 - mentally unstable male that was threatening to shoot his caregiver and supposedly had a gun in residence was contacted without incident outside the apartment, leaving the gun inside.

2/26 – 59 Road/Mesa County line - SARC for a subject that pressed his SOS signal, owner was contacted and he activated the SOS for two teenage boys that got their vehicle stuck, the Forest Service responded to retrieve them; 2425 Mesa Ave - 66 year old male, DOA from a self-inflicted gunshot wound; 23 Road and H Road - one vehicle rollover accident, came to a stop upside down in ditch, female driver did not sustain any injuries; 447 Shire Drive Unite B - suicidal/homicidal male coming down off of meth showed up at his ex-wife's house with a gun, the MCSO and GJPD responded and detained the subject without incident; Cold Shivers Point/CNM – intoxicated male missing from group of friends, was eventually located at 1st Street and Grand Avenue uninjured.

2/27- SARC on Uncompanier Butte – a male subject went shed hunting and had not returned, SO searched multiple locations for several hours, male was finally located in the Cactus Park area the next morning, uninjured; 25 Road and Patterson – female crashed her vehicle into a tree and ran into the gas station, asked witnesses not to call dispatch.

2/28 –3297 El Jardin – BURGI - suspect fled on a bike while deputies were en route, deputies spotted him in Candlewood Trailer Park, the Sergeant deployed his taser and the suspect was

taken in to custody without incident; St. Mary's Hospital diverted incoming patients, except critical after a flood in their Data center took all of their computers and X-ray equipment offline; 2809 Perry Dr – BURGI - intruder with a knife physically fighting with homeowner, suspect transported for injury to face from victims hands.

2/29 - Nisley Elementary put in shelter in place due to a male walking around the area with what appeared to be a gun, subject was never located; GJ Airport - Alert 1 - gulf stream with 10 souls on board and 9000 lbs of fuel was experiencing rapid decompression, landed without incident; CMU – an adult male texted a female from outside her dorm indicating he had a gun and asked her to come outside, he made entry into the dorm, RA took all the students into an office and the male was detained without incident; 535 Teller - 57 year old female found DOA during a welfare check; Taco Bell/Highway 6 & 50 – an employee went out to his vehicle after getting off work, there was a suspicious male sitting in the employee's vehicle and refused to get out, when officers arrived the male subject was holding something in his hand and told Officers it was a gun, a foot pursuit ensued, he was detained and found to be holding a cigarette lighter that looked like a gun.
