Background:

An evaluation to determine the appropriate posted speed for the segment of 6th Street from Orchard Avenue to Bookcliff Avenue was conducted on February 26, 2002. That evaluation was performed in accordance with and pursuant to Part 11, Section 1102 part 1 and 2 of the 1995 Model Traffic Code, section 2B-11 of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices 2000 and the *City of Grand Junction Speed Evaluation Standards*. The evaluation was reviewed by the Transportation Engineer and in her opinion is consistent with conscientious, reasonable and prudent traffic engineering standards and practices.

Findings:

6th Street from Orchard Avenue to Bookcliff Avenue is a two lane local street. Surrounding land uses are primarily multi-family residential. 6th Street is on the school walking route for Tope elementary. There is a school crossing at 6th St. & Walnut Ave. Walnut Ave. currently posted at 20 MPH. Findings on file at City of Grand Junction Transportation Engineering Department, (970 256-4110).

Speed Regulation:

6th Street from Orchard Avenue to Bookcliff Avenue shall be posted 20 MPH
