Background:

An evaluation to determine the appropriate posted speed for the segment of Bookcliff Avenue from N. 1st Street to Consistory Court was conducted on August 19, 2004. That evaluation was performed in accordance with and pursuant to Part 11, Section 1102 part 1 and 2 of the 1995 Model Traffic Code, section 2B-11 of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices 2000 and the *City of Grand Junction Speed Evaluation Standards*. The evaluation was reviewed by the Transportation Engineer and in her opinion is consistent with conscientious, reasonable and prudent traffic engineering standards and practices.

Findings:

No mechanical speed recorded. Area is local residential street with no curb gutter & sidewalk. findings on file at City of Grand Junction Transportation Engineering Department, (970 256-4110).

Speed Regulation:

Bookcliff Avenue from N. 1st Street to and including Consistory Court and McFarland Ct. shall be posted 20 MPH.
