Background:

An evaluation to determine the appropriate posted speed for the segment of Summer Hill Way from 26 1/2 Rd. to Summer Bend Ct. was conducted on January 20, 2006. That evaluation was performed in accordance with and pursuant to Part 11, Section 1102 part 1 and 2 of the 1995 Model Traffic Code, section 2B-13 of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices 2003 and the *City of Grand Junction Speed Evaluation Standards*. The evaluation was reviewed by the Transportation Engineer and in her opinion is consistent with conscientious, reasonable and prudent traffic engineering standards and practices.

Findings:

No mechanical speed recorded. Summer Hill Way is 28 ft. local residential collector street with curb gutter & sidewalk. Spring Crossing, S. Haven Crest Ct., Haven Hill Dr. are all local residential street connecting into Paradise Hills, Lanai Dr. which is currently posted 20 MPH. Speed Regulation:

Summer Hill Way from 26 1/2 Rd. to Summer Bend Ct. shall be posted 25 MPH.

Summer Hill Way from Summer Bend Ct. to S. Haven Ct. and includings S. Haven Ct. , Haven Crest. Cir. and Haven Hill Dr. shall be posted 20 MPH.
