Background:

An evaluation to determine the appropriate posted speed for the segment of Crossing St. from F 1/2 Rd. to Madison Ave to also include Gemstone Way, Hayes Dr. & Buchanan Dr. was conducted on June 22, 2006. That evaluation was performed in accordance with and pursuant to Part 11, Section 1102 part 1 and 2 of the 1995 Model Traffic Code, section 2B-13 of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices 2003 and the *City of Grand Junction Speed Evaluation Standards*. The evaluation was reviewed by the Transportation Engineer and in her opinion is consistent with conscientious, reasonable and prudent traffic engineering standards and practices.

Findings:

Speed study conducted. Roadways are all local residential, like street in the area have been posted at 25 MPH.

Speed Regulation:

Crossing St., Gemstone Way, Hayes Dr. & Buchanan Dr. shall all be posted 25 MPH. All connecting streets (Garrett Wy, Marshall St, Onyx Dr, Miranda St, Garnet Av, Madison Av, Pirece Av, Filmore Av, Patriot ct, Polk Ct an Arthur Ct) are within the posted Speed limit.
