Background:

An evaluation to determine the appropriate posted speed for the segment of Shavano Street from 29 1/2 Road to end of roadway and including all connecting street was conducted on June 18, 2008. That evaluation was performed in accordance with and pursuant to Part 11, Section 1102 part 1 and 2 of the 1995 Model Traffic Code, section 2B-13 of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices 2003 and the *City of Grand Junction Speed Evaluation Standards*. The evaluation was reviewed by the Transportation Engineer and in her opinion is consistent with conscientious, reasonable and prudent traffic engineering standards and practices.

Findings:

No mechanical speed data. Street is a local residential 28 ft. wide no outlet street with curb gutter and sidewalk. Findings on file at City of Grand Junction Transportation Engineering Department, (970 256-4110).

Speed Regulation:

Shavano Street shall be posted 20 MPH from 29 1/2 Rd. west to end of roadway. Posting shall also apply to all connecting streets; Shavano Ct., Lasalle Ct. and Crestone Ct.
