Background:

An evaluation to determine the appropriate posted speed for the segment of Renaissance Blvd., Mescalero Ave. and Altamira Ave from South Camp Rd. to All connecting streets within The Renaissance in the Redlands and the Trails West Village Subdivisions. was conducted on December 8, 2010. That evaluation was performed in accordance with and pursuant to Part 11, Section 1102 part 1 and 2 of the 1995 Model Traffic Code, section 2B-13 of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices 2003 and the *City of Grand Junction Speed Evaluation Standards*. The evaluation was reviewed by the Transportation Engineer and in her opinion is consistent with conscientious, reasonable and prudent traffic engineering standards and practices.

Findings:

No mechanical speed data collected. Area has curb gutter & sidewalk. Streets are standard and a lot of curves. Findings on file at City of Grand Junction Transportation Engineering Department, (970 256-4110).

Speed Regulation:

Renaissance Blvd., Mescalero Ave. and Altamira Ave. Shall be posted 20 MPH. All connecting streets within The Renaissance in the Redlands and the Trails West Village Subdivisions shall fall under the 20 MPH postings.
