Summary-

5/1 – a male showed up at St. Mary's with a gunshot wound to the chest, the shooting occurred near the VA Hospital, Officers found a single gunshot in the victims vehicle, the victim indicated he was in an altercation with the subject, followed his vehicle until the subject got out of his vehicle and fired at the victim.

5/2 – 466 32 1/8 Road – vehicle was taken from residence; St. Mary's – a male arrived at the hospital with a gunshot wound to his leg, refused to give any info other than it was accidental/self-inflicted; 527 28 ½ Road – RP called in stating he was pointing his shotgun at a male subject that was trying to break in to his residence, the male did make entry and Officers arrived before any shots were fired.

5/3 – Tequila's/North Avenue – vehicle versus bicycle, male was transported to St. Mary's C3, he was uncooperative and vitals were not stable in transit; Texas Roadhouse/North Avenue – passenger vehicle rolled over, one person in the vehicle, sustained minor injuries; 488 32 Road – residents in the area were

instructed to shelter in place while the SO attempted to contact a suspect in a previous shooting, male was taken in to custody without incident. 5/4 – Colorado National Monument/Lower No Thoroughfare – SARC was dispatched for a female that fractured her leg when her backpack got caught on a rock and the rock was pulled down on to her knee and upper thigh; 2897 North Avenue – two females were in an altercation, one female had a bat and threatened to stab the other subject, law enforcement was able to contact both parties without incident; 246 Belford Ave. – RP found a note in the laundry room stating "Real pipe bomb at 4:20, Get out innocence.", no bombs found; 555 Highway 50 #6 – welfare check resulted in a male found DOA; 2525 Broadway/Western Convenience – a suicidal male was complaining to a coworker and the coworker pointed a gun at the male and told him to just kill himself, the suicidal subject's brother picked him up at the gas station and called dispatch, the coworker was contacted by the PD and found in possession of a un-fire able black powder pistol, incident occurred at a different location and the case was transferred to the SO; Stolen vehicle out of Montrose was followed by CSP to the area of Clifton Wendy's, the male driver dumped his bag and gun at Murdoch's then hid in a nearby neighborhood, residents in the area were notified to shelter in place, the male was taken in to custody without incident; 1761 L ½ Road – two toddlers were reported to be seen walking in the middle of the road without clothes on, the mother was contacted in the area; 850 Elm Drive – GJPD watched the address for a male wanted out of Aurora for homicide, he was contacted and arrested during a traffic stop at 7th and Wellington without incident; St. Mary's – a female came in to the ICU and stated someone pulled a gun on her in the parking lot, the hospital was put on lockdown while security checked the parking areas, eventually it was discovered that the female witnessed the SWAT team arresting the suspect at 7th and Wellington and didn't understand what was happening, a VAP was requested for the female.

5/6 – 846 River Ranch Ct. – structure fire started in a shed and spread to a nearby house, Lower Valley and GJFD responded.

5/7 – 235 S Elm/Fruita – 24 year old female found unresponsive and submerged in her bathtub, female was not able to be saved.

5/11 – E Greenfield Cir/Bookcliff Avenue – a male described as "Crocodile Dundee-ish" was breaking in to vehicles and a home in the area, SO searched the area and requested a PD K9 to respond, the suspect was not located; PD Officer called out with three at gunpoint near Bookcliff Middle School, one of the suspects had a gun, the PD and SO responded C3 and the school was briefly put on lockdown, the scene was under control relatively quickly; Multiple DOA medical calls today; Potholes – a 19 year old male jumped into the water, was pulled under and washed downstream for about four minutes, his friends were able to pull him from the water, bystanders attempted CPR and it was 20 minutes before anyone

could get cell service, he was transported via CareFlight to St. Mary's where he passed away.

5/13 – 28 Road/Belford Avenue – vehicle versus 13 year old male on a bicycle, the bicycle rider was transported to St. Mary's with head injuries; 491 28 ¼ Road #1201 – an intoxicated female attempted to break in to the address, she was transported to St. Mary's; Candlewood Trailer Park #441 – two males broke in to the address through a pet door while the homeowner was out, the suspects took the RP's gun and threatened him with it when he got home, the suspects left before deputies arrived and were not located.

5/15 – 3153 Glendam Road – a neighbor called to report they saw a male laying on the couch not breathing or responding to his pounding on the door, deputies arrived and determined the male was deceased from a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the chest; 3140 Belford – a fire started in the home's oven, the homeowner was able to extinguish most of the fire, Clifton Fire did respond; North Avenue Walmart – seven subjects were fighting, one person did get a broken nose, all subjects were contacted.

5/16 – Fruita/Highway 340 Bridge – a suicidal male jumped off the bridge, promptly got himself out of the river and was transported to the hospital; City Hall – GJFD responded to reports of gas smells coming from the vents; DeBeque – vehicle pursuit, an intoxicated male led three deputy marshal's on a 20 mph pursuit to his home address where he was arrested.

5/17 – Highway 340/West Avenue – two vehicle crash, one vehicle rolled, minor injuries sustained; Grand Ave/23rd-24th Streets – stolen Blazer was being followed by several RP's, the vehicle took out a chain link fence at the School District building, suspect ended up at 3439 C ½ Road, threatened the residents (owners of the Blazer) with a gun, male was taken to jail and the stolen vehicle was recovered in the desert; Mesa County Fairgrounds – female was involved in a domestic violence incident in the area, she was hit in the head with a bat and transported to St. Mary's C2; 141 Orchard Ave. – an anonymous tip was received that a male wanted in relation to a shooting was in the area, two vehicles left the address and law enforcement was not able to immediately contact, one vehicle returned and a male was taken in to custody for multiple warrants, it was not the same male from the original tip that was called in.

5/18 – 1015 North Avenue – a male suspect attempted to rob the gas station, held the clerk up with a gun, left on foot and was not located by law enforcement; 195 Sunlight Drive – fully engulfed structure fire, GJFD found a dog inside the home unharmed; 3298 Silver Fox Ct. – a truck crashed in to the residence, no injuries involved and the juveniles that were in the truck left the scene and were not located by law enforcement; North Avenue Arby's – bicycle versus truck, bicycle rider was pinned under the truck and taken to St. Mary's with leg injuries.

5/20 – Community Hospital – HAZMAT responded for a patient that was exposed to chlorine powder used in hot tubs brought in a sample to the ER; Coal Canyon – 35 year old male was stuck on the ridge, SARC responded and rescued the male, no injuries; 814 Noland – fully involved structure fire, one male was transported C3 with 3rd degree burns to face and an open right brachial artery, CPR was started as ambulance was pulling in to St. Mary's.

5/21 – Andy's Loop – mountain bike racer crashed, sustained injuries to his head but walked himself to the ambulance; Horsethief Trail – mountain bike crash, SARC and Lower Valley Fire rescued the rider who had a possible broken arm; 25 Road/Desert – a13 year old dirt bike rider was reported missing, was located about an hour later unharmed; an intoxicated male called in to report his friend was having a seizure, they were under the 32 Road overpass, the RP was too intoxicated to perform CPR, but did mention he could "hit him with a rock to help him", patient was transported to Community Hospital; a deputy's patrol vehicle was backed in to when he arrived home after his shift, minor damage.

5/22 – area of 30 Road & Patterson – several calls on a REDDI driver that drove the vehicle onto the sidewalk and then reversed in traffic, one concerned citizen followed the vehicle with its hazards on and they ended up on the interstate, deputies and a Palisade officer eventually got the vehicle stopped at exit 42, the driver had a previous DUI and was driving on an adult instructional permit; Grand Junction Airport – an 83 year old male was struck by a vehicle that left the scene, the victim had broken bones and facial lacerations, about two hours later the vehicle involved was located on the side of the road with the driver passed out inside.

5/23 – 30 & D Road – a male threatened a GVT driver, the male left the area on foot, officers pursued on foot and contacted the suspect at Taser point; Tope Elementary – bomb threat received, while units were clearing the building dispatch received a teletype from Ft. Collins PD asking if any threats had been received, there were apparently a dozen similar calls to schools in the State that turned out to be false reports; 534 Garland Avenue – a wanted subject ran from deputies and a community notification was sent to area residents to watch for the subject; Taber Auto Body – a male subject who had been evicted from a residence that is owned by the owner of Taber Auto Body came into the business threatening the owner, indicated he would go get a gun, the male subject flashed a gun to another male outside of the business, the subject left the area and was not immediately located by law enforcement; 147 Kent Street/Fruita – a male attempted suicide by asphyxiation in his garage, Lower Valley Fire found the male mildly responsive inside his vehicle, transported him to St. Mary's.

5/24 – 32 ½ Road/South of railroad tracks – a camper that was on fire spread to a nearby field, all train traffic was suspended while the fire was extinguished; a rollover on Ridges Blvd started as a REDDI near McDonald's on North Avenue,

when officers arrived at the accident scene the vehicle was abandoned, the male driver had fled with a child passenger, but both were located in the area without significant injury, the male was arrested and law enforcement stayed with the child until relatives could pick him up; 3202 E Road – a male was shot in the abdomen by an unknown suspect, the suspect left in a passenger car and the victim was transported to St. Mary's, the suspect was located several hours later and taken to jail; SUV rolled at the westbound Port of Entry, the driver was pinned and a single lane of I-70 was closed.

5/29 – 18 Road/V 6/10 Road – a male from out of state was camping in the area, took a drive to get his two babies to sleep, took a wrong turn and ended up in some rough terrain, the vehicle crashed into a tree and a tree limb went through the window, SARC and Lower Valley Fire responded, no one was injured; a female fell while looking over the rocks near 16 Road and V 8/10 Road, sustained an open leg fracture and injured her hip and arm, SARC was able to get the patient out of the area, CareFlight transported her to St. Mary's; 1532 10 Road – brush fire that was started by two juveniles who started a camp fire, fire traveled about 3 acres and BLM used a helicopter to drop water over the area and contained the burn; DeBeque cutoff – male found DOA on the side of the road with a gunshot wound to the head, a pistol was lying next to him; Mary's Loop -3^{rd} SARC of the day when a bicyclist crashed and sustained a leg fracture; Spring Creek Trail/Coal Canyon – 4th SARC of the day – two adults and two teenagers got lost while hiking, they had been out for seven hours before calling dispatch around 1800, no one was injured-they just couldn't find their way out, SARC located the group around 2200, but had to stop and wait until daylight before heading out of the area.
