Summary-

6/3 – Village Fair Shopping Center – 12th & Patterson – AC unit was fully engulfed causing damage to several businesses, GJFD was able to get the fire extinguished, no injuries were reported.

6/4 – 307 Main Street/Ruby Canyon Cycles – AC unit caught on fire, damage was isolated to the roof; Hwy 141 MM152 – three motorcycle's crashed, two patients were transported, one with a back injury and the other with a head injury; Hwy 65/45 ½ Road – a male victim was bit and assaulted with a shovel by his "friend" that was under the influence of drugs and has PTSD.

6/6 – 7th Street & North Ave – multiple vehicle crash, 6 patients, several of which were transported to St. Mary's.

6/7 – 2656 Little Bookcliff Unit #207 – a male subject told a home health care nurse that he had a bomb, several units responded, but no bomb was located, the male has PTSD and there was a history of similar issues; Fisher Liquor Barn parking lot – 18 year old female collapsed for unknown reasons, bystanders started CPR immediately, she was transported C3 to St. Mary's, shocked twice in the

ambulance and finally got a pulse while en route; Cherry St & Aspen St/Fruita – vehicle vs. pedestrian, minor injuries; teenaged female took an elderly couple that she did not know for a drive over the Monument, her parents panicked when they could not reach her, they were located quite a while later and all was fine, the parents were going to counsel their daughter on the perils of trusting strangers.

6/9 – Collbran/Highway 330 – missing male and female out of Larimer County were believed to be at a residence in the area that belonged to the males grandparents, the female was suspected to be in danger and taken against her will, MCSO, including SWAT, responded to the address, contacted the male and took him in to custody, the female was found deceased in the back seat of the males truck.

6/12 – Mi Mexico/Highway 6 & 50 – five ducklings fell in to the storm grate behind the business, mama duck was frantically running around trying to get to them, GJFD Truck3 and Battalion Chief 1 were able to rescue all of them!

6/13 – 585 25 ½ Road – 3 year old child was found wandering in the area for the second time in a week, CPS was called out to the parent's home(space 217), unknown outcome.

6/15 – 50 year old male, who was a suspect in a child pornography case, had an interview at the PD at 1600, he sent a text to his family telling them he was sorry, a suicidal call was created for his address in Palisade, male was not there and his vehicle was located at in the PD lobby parking lot, security footage revealed the male got out of vehicle and approached the building, his body was found in the bushes to the west of the lobby entrance with a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head; 935 N 12th Street – vehicle vs. pedestrian, a 23 year old female was taken C2 to St. Mary's.

6/17 – Redlands Parkway/Parkway Ramp – vehicle vs. motorcycle, motorcycle rider was taken C2 to the hospital with a shoulder injury; 1343 13 3/10 Road – 45 year old male called in reporting he thought he was having a heart attack, no prior history of cardiac events, he passed away in the ambulance while being transported; 1610 18 Road – 40 year old male called to report an accidental discharge/self-inflicted gunshot wound to his leg, thought the bullet may have been lodged in his heel; 4th St/Salvation Army – female hung herself behind the address.

6/18 – MCSO/FPD/LVFD/CSP were all out at MM 204 in Utah after a suspect fled from UHP after a high speed pursuit, the RO on the plate returned to a reporting party that called in to local dispatch on 6/17.

6/19 – Horizon Drive/27 ½ Road – large brush fire the grew quickly but not structures were lost or damaged; Rattlesnake Arches Trail/Hole in the Bridge Arch – female was reported with having heat exposure issues, was vomiting and went to sleep while responders were en route.

6/20 – GJPD was out at 344 ½ South Avenue and several other addresses looking for a suspect in a vehicle vs. pedestrian hit and run at 12th & Belford.

6/21 – 32 Road/Hwy 50 – motorcycle vs. truck, the motorcycle rider was taken C3 to St. Mary's with significant head injuries; 935 E Harrison – structure fire at the residence, the homeowner was not home and a note was left by Lower Valley Fire; Large brush fire was reported by City Shops address, GJFD worked the incident for several hours; 1489 O Road – vacant, double wide mobile home caught fire; Area of Hwy 139 & X Road – SARC was called out for a female that was stranded without water and gas for her ATV, she texted a coworker at Lower Valley Fire for help, responders located her without injuries and she was able to walk out; Electrical fire reported at Horizon Drive Village Inn.

6/22 – 31 ½ & E ½ Road – motorcycle vs. vehicle crash, the motorcycle rider was DOA, four VAPS were paged to the scene, a large group gathered in the area and became uncooperative, one was tazed, one was arrested.

6/23 – 543 N 20th Street – subject was pushed out a vehicle by someone inside the car who said he was overdosing, the RP (bystander in their front yard) was very uncooperative with the TC and no additional details were given to dispatch; 13 ½ miles north of V 2/10 Road – brush fire started with two trees that were struck by lightning, BLM handled the incident; 700 Denver Ave #7/DeBeque – hot water blew up in the RP's face, RP also had injury to her hand.

6/24 – 2673 Paradise Drive – 8 month old baby was found in a swimming pool, CPR was started on scene by GJPD then GJFD, they were able to get a pulse and transported the infant to St. Mary's and eventually flown to Children's Hospital in Denver; I70 between 25 and 27 Roads – several weed fires reported, 81 phone calls to 9-1-1 in less than 20 minutes; 25 Road at Highline Canal – vehicle hit the guard rail and became submerged in the canal; two people and a dog were DOA and recovered from the vehicle.

6/26 – 615 28 ¼ Road – 4 year old male found wandering the streets at 0330; unable to locate the parents and CPS took custody of the child, the mother finally called at 1000 to report her 3 year old son missing; 2668 Paradise Way – structure fire in the attic.

6/27 – 4214 S Hwy 50 – a female called to report her 14 year old son “made a 5 year old female do something to him” sexual in nature, RP was extremely upset and difficult to get additional info out of; 2927 Jon Hall – a shed caught fire and it spread to the residence; three adults, three children and one cat was displaced; A fiber line was cut between GJ and Montrose, southwest Colorado 9-1-1 lines were down for a period of time.

6/28 – 25 Road and G Road – motor vehicle fire was reported, including an explosion, several calls came in for the incident and LE stopped traffic on 25 Road due to smoke.

6/29 – 1825 Broadway – brush fire started when a squirrel got on to a transformer and caught fire, the flaming squirrel then fell into the dry grass; I-70B & 29 Road – a male crashed into a drainage ditch while having a seizure; 2842 North Ave – juveniles cut into a fireworks tent, took merchandise and proceeded to set off the stolen goods nearby, officers were able to locate the suspects by the bright, sparkly lights in the sky.
