Summary-

7/1 – Rockslide on I-70 east of Exit 42, received several calls; 215 Rice St./MCSO – a suicidal female showed up to the SO parking lot with a nearly severed arm caused by some type of chain, she was transported to St. Mary’s where her boyfriend later showed up with facial injuries.

7/2 – St. Mary’s Hospital – a stabbing victim from a party showed up at the hospital and was admitted, a group of people gathered in the parking garage and a fight ensued leaving one male with a facial injury, another male suspect discharged a firearm at the ground which injured a female bystander’s leg; 2507 Hwy 6 & 50/Carville’s Auto – a Blazer was stolen from the business and the subject stated he was a suspect from an assault the previous day, he was believed to be armed but was not immediately contacted; 2301 Whitewater Creek Road – an insurance salesman reported arriving at the residence and the keys were still in the door and there was a strange odor in the home, a welfare check by Deputies found one subject DOA inside, unknown cause; Utah/Colorado border – SARC was called out to two females that had their boat flip over on them, they were stranded but

uninjured; One brush fire at 18 Road and the Desert, three other separate brush fires north of the Interstate in the area of MM30; MS Road / 5 7/10 Road – a female was struck by lightning, was taken C2 to St. Mary's for head pain; Glade Park near Mud Springs – SARC responded for a 14 year old female that went missing near her cabin in the area of the campgrounds, she was later located at the Glade Park Store with a friend; G Road / 37 1/10 Road – rollover accident resulted in a motor vehicle fire, the vehicle hit large rocks at a high rate of speed, both occupants were unresponsive inside the vehicle, one male and pregnant female were pronounced dead at the scene; St. Mary's ER – an unresponsive 6 year old male was brought in to the ER by his mother, and was later pronounced dead, an investigation was initiated; James Trailer Park #15 – GJPD responded to a verbal call, male subject charged officers with a vehicle as he fled, a female involved that was believed to be kidnapped in the car was later located during a search of the trailer, the female had multiple warrants and was an escapee, the male was not contacted; North Avenue McDonalds – a male was reported pulling a gun in and out of his waistband, he fled from the PD on a bicycle but was quickly located and stopped, Officers retrieved the gun that happened to belong to the subject in the earlier verbal call at the trailer park.

7/3 – 21 Road & Hwy 6 & 50 – brush fire started by fireworks on an island in a lake near the area, the island was uninhabited so the GJFD let it burn; 12th & Patterson City Market – a female reported two males pulled up in a vehicle next to hers and pointed a pistol at her, the males were contacted and taken to jail; North Avenue Sonic – party complaint that resulted to officers responding again to the same unit in James Trailer Park as the night before, one officer was in a struggle with a suspect, a male subject was taken in to custody, but not the male from the previous night; 485 32 ½ Road – a vehicle was on fire near an apartment complex, residents were asked to evacuate, the vehicle became fully engulfed, but was contained and did not cause damage to any nearby structures.

7/9 – 435 Lark Drive – two males were reported fighting, one male pointed a gun at the other, RP heard a gunshot but didn't see anything except a black SUV leaving the area, a motorcycle came back to the area that fled from a deputy earlier in the day, they eventually got consent to search the home and surrounding area, one subject was contacted and taken in to custody; Jerry's Outdoor Sports – a female subject known to be attempting theft of ammo from are sporting goods stores was seen in Jerry's, she left before LE arrived but her vehicle was contacted at Ace Hardware in Clifton and a C6 male was taken into custody, the female fled the building through a back door and was not immediately located; 9th St & White Ave – large fight including 15-20 subjects, GJFD was called out C3 to the scene; Horizon Drive – a female contacted On-Star in her vehicle claiming she had been stabbed twice and robbed, her GPS showed her near Applebee's, she was uncooperative and left on I-70 eastbound, she wouldn't pull over and was

eventually contacted by Eagle County and was found to be off her medication, had not been stabbed or robbed; 5th Street & Grand Mesa Ave – motorcycle crash resulted in minor injuries.

7/16 – Today was suicidal, Code 5, prowler/burglary in progress and fight night...D 7/8 Road & 32 ½ Road – one male was reported yelling “Black Lives Matter” as he wandered around the neighborhood; I-70 MM27 and 37 – approximately 8 brush fires in the area.

7/17 – Redlands Parkway bridge – one male body found in the water under the bridge, his identity was not immediately known; Persigo wash area – another male body found along the river, also unknown identity and unknown at the time if males were connected; Pitkin County – the BOMB team was requested by Pitkin County for a reported bomb in a Basalt residence, in the meantime the suspect came to Grand Junction and was arrested at 1610 Maple Ct, the BOMB team did find a bomb in his house in Basalt.

7/21 – Caprock Academy – a fire was reported on the roof of the building, GJFD responded and extinguished the active fire, was contained to the roof area; A stolen vehicle reported out of Pueblo was tracked by its GPS as entering Mesa County from Delta, the SO followed the vehicle throughout the county, the male subject left the vehicle at 2842 Chipeta and fled through the area, he was eventually taken into custody at gunpoint at 28 ¼ & North Avenue; A truck hauling a trailer rolled on I70 at mile marker 30, no injuries were sustained;

7/23 – 1399 12 ½ Road – a controlled burn caught a neighboring haystack on fire; 518 ½ Garland St. – wanted subjects were arrested after one of them was gassed out of the crawl space; 18 Road & Q 5/10 Road – an off-road vehicle crash resulted in one patient transported to St. Mary’s C2 with a head wound; Mind Springs – a male patient that left his assisted living home threatened to slit the throats of all of the staff, he did have some type of shank with him but was taken to St. Mary’s without further incident; St. Mary’s – a male showed up reporting he had been assaulted, told responding Officers he was robbed near Texas Roadhouse.

7/24 – Uncompahgre/Mesa County – a vehicle belonging to a missing Delta County woman was found unoccupied, ground and air personnel started a search of the area; Whitman Park – a female subject was run over by a City of Grand Junction Parks Department pick-up, she was hit by both the front and rear wheels across her abdomen, patient was transported C3 to St. Mary’s.

7/29 – Pollock Bench Trailhead – a female hiker was reported lost in the area; 27 ¼ Road & the Desert – an ATV rolled over, CareFlight transported one male with a lower back injury.

7/31 – 316 E Highland – a stolen vehicle was recovered while LE responded to an assault in progress; Fruita/Car Barn – what was believed to be a structure fire turned out to be grass around a mobile home, fire was ignited from drug paraphernalia.

A Laboratory form, used for the A/V Technician, was modified to track cell phone and computer forensics. A Training Bulletin was generated for employees to notify them of the changes.

CBI had Criminalist Rundquist testify at a Shreck hearing in Breckenridge. The court hearing was to show the validity of Latent Prints and CBI's procedures. The case had not been worked by Criminalist Rundquist, but CBI felt he was the best representative from CBI to testify to the science of latent print identification.
