DOA at the address; 1515 Baxter Ave., Space 32 – a male subject poured gasoline all over a female then set her and the trailer house on fire, the female was able to get out and was transported to C2 to St. Mary's with second and third degree burns, male was taken in to custody; a Code 5 (and Code6) female was taken to jail after running around barefoot (and unsuccessfully attempting to climb a tree), threatening to kill customers and staff at the Orchard Mesa Maverik convenience store.

8/8 – Highway 50/Mile Marker 45 – vehicle crash, one female patient required extrication, transported by CareFlight to St. Mary's; Garfield County Road 204/Mile Marker 10 – cement truck rolled over, minor injuries.

8/17 – 1026 Echo Canyon – a 9-1-1 hang up came in, Fruita PD responded and found one male subject sitting in a Jacuzzi with a gun to his head, the male was detained without incident; Central High School – a 15 year old male was not conscious and not breathing, CPR was administered and an AED was used by school staff, patient was transported C2 to the hospital; 490 29 Road – a female was reported lying face down on the sidewalk with a 5 year old child playing beside her, EMS was unable to locate the subject and child when responding; 3152 F ½ Road – female ran over her ex-husband because he wouldn't move out of the way and she bit him, patient refused medical attention, sustained an injured foot; FBI received an alert of a vehicle on I-70 with a suspect involved in an amber alert, Palisade PD pulled the vehicle over and the male was taken in to custody, child was released to DHS, had been missing out of Tennessee for 13 days.

8/18 – Dispatcher Rebecca Kassaw helped deliver a healthy baby girl while the mother was in a vehicle; 2385 ½ S San Miguel Drive – a male subject was reported walking around the outside of his home naked every day, deputies responded and the male became very aggressive, made homicidal threats, but was eventually detained without incident.

8/26 – An overabundance of Party calls; I-70/Mile Marker 62 – three vehicle crash, eight patients needed transported C2, DeBeque, Palisade and Grand Valley units all responded.

8/27 – More parties...several noise complaints from the Ale House and Lincoln Park.

8/28 – 515 April Lane #B – auto theft/robbery – a vehicle failed to yield when a deputy tried to pull it over, caused a crash, both the female and the male were located and taken in to custody; Gateway Area – SARC responded for a 50 year old male who took off in the area after having an argument with his girlfriend, subject was believed to be suicidal; 1810 North Ave – a male subject assaulted a female and tried to pull her out of her car (with her child in the vehicle), GJPD saw the vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed on the interstate without headlights, vehicle failed to yield, FPD, CSP and SO were also assisting to stop the vehicle, eventually stopped following, suspect was not immediately located.

- Participated in agency-wide Volunteer Fair at Mesa Mall on Aug. 13

Training:

- At our monthly VAP meeting, firefighter Brian Clark presented training on compression-only CPR. This was followed by a "VAP training VAP" interactive exercise, since our seven new VAP trainees joined us at the meeting.
- VAP training academy began 8/18, Tuesday and Thursday evenings, for 3+ hours per night. Topics in our August sessions included: procedures/protocols in victim advocacy, scene safety, Victim Rights Act, VINE notification, domestic violence and tour of Latimer House, and Dispatch protocol for victim advocates.

Other:

- Coordinator completed interviews of prospective VAP candidates, and finalized training schedule
- Volunteer placed 90 follow-up phone calls to victims of inactivated property crimes (left messages for 49 of these welfare calls)
