Summary-

11/2 – Grand Junction High School – one male subject found in a vehicle with a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head.

11/4 – subject(s) in a vehicle that was stopped was found to be in possession of approximately 12 stolen firearms; Redlands Dos Hombres – Two subjects broke into the business, fled the address with stolen items, flipped their trailer and continued on foot through Riverside, dumping the stolen items; 1st Street and Main – one vehicle rollover accident, no injuries reported and pedestrian's at the scene were able to flip the car back over; 32 Road/William Drive – three vehicle head-on crash, resulted in a major traffic block; 29 ½ Road/Orchard Avenue – a female driver was reported driving the wrong direction, very slow, Officers were able to stop her and determined she was having a diabetic issue, this was the fourth time this subject has been reported as a REDDI this year; 1950 Barcelona – a male subject hit another male with a bat, the victim was transported by the PD to St. Mary's; Three vehicles were recovered in different areas around town; 29705 Highway 141 – a suspicious van was trying to avoid a deputy, the driver

abandoned the van in the brush on the property, one male subject was detained at gun point and taken in to custody; a second subject was detained after a brief search of the area and transported to St. Mary's for medical concerns; 10th Street and Grand Avenue – vehicle vs. bicycle crash, one patient was critically injured, another patient sustained minor injuries.

11/6 – Orchard Mesa City Market – a female driving a vehicle called to report she had a male passenger in her car that was shot in the chest, the female refused to pull over and drove the subject to St. Mary's, at the same time another RP called to report two subjects shooting at each other from vehicles in the 3200 block of B ½ Road and watched the suspect(s) leave, MCSO and CSP followed a suspicious vehicle traveling the last known direction of one of the shooting suspect vehicles, at which time another call came in from a driver stating his pregnant wife had been shot and he believed she was deceased in the passenger seat, CSP pursued the RP's vehicle through Delta while dispatch stayed on the line with the driver, the driver was finally stopped and taken into custody, the wife was DOA.

11/9 – I-70 Mile Marker 17 – one vehicle rollover after hitting a deer, two patients were transported Code 2; Area of 32 Road and C Road – a 54 year old male rolled a jeep and was ejected, male was taken to St. Mary's Code 2; 29 Road and North Avenue – vehicle vs. pedestrian, pedestrian sustained an open ankle fracture and was taken to St. Mary's Code 3.

11/10 – Pepsi Bottling Plant/Power Road – structure fire was reported and extinguished with little damage, resulted from a small trash fire in the fleet shop; 3053 Wellington – shots fired resulting in four males taken into custody.

11/11 – 9th Street and Pitkin Avenue – PD officer initiated a SUSP call, immediately called for C3 backup and then stated shots fired, officer became pinned between suspect's vehicle and a building, the officer was transported to St. Mary's with a knee injury, suspect was involved in an incident early in the week involving fleeing from a traffic stop, he was pronounced dead at the scene.

11/12 – 3060 Sandpiper Avenue – 11 year old male was shot in the chest at a residence, the adult male who fired the weapon was intoxicated and “messing” around with the firearm not realizing it was loaded, an ambulance responded and transported the child to St. Mary's, attempting to revive him but were unsuccessful.

11/16 – 1190 Micaelas Place – 41 year old male shot himself in the head after arguing with his girlfriend, the GJFD transported the patient C3 to St. Mary's.

11/20 – 3190 I-70 Frontage Road – MCSO SWAT (with assistance from GJPD SWAT) executed a warrant for one subject with several warrants; Elm Drive & Hwy 50 – MCSO Deputy stopped a driver reported through a REDDI, the driver was a sovereign citizen, very uncooperative and locked himself in his vehicle, deputies forced entry into his vehicle and took him in to custody, one deputy sustained a laceration to his hand during the incident; 320 Gunnison Avenue – 35

year old male found deceased by his brother, suspicious circumstances concerning the victim's ex-wife.

11/22 – 5th Street Bridge – large fight that caused traffic to back up significantly, weapons were reported to be on scene including a gun and a 2x4, multiple units responded including GJPD, MCSO, FBI and GJFD; 320 Gunnison Avenue – father of the male found deceased two day prior found his sons estranged wife removing items from the home.

11/23 – 4th & Main – female suspect stole a vehicle that was left running at the Wells Fargo ATM, suspect was apprehended at the Orchard Mesa Cemetery; 1652 17 Road – MCSO responded to an auto theft with assistance from the Fruita PD, the suspect stole a vehicle and nearly ran over the owner while fleeing; 33117 Willow Bend Road/Whitewater – male subject smacked another male in the head with the butt of a pistol, the suspect was known to the victim, an ambulance responded for a head injury; F ½ Road & Irish Walk – a high risk warrant apprehension took place with one male taken into custody.

11/27 – 2632 Elm Avenue – a large fight in the area, shots were fired but no one was reportedly injured, the suspect was a 17-18 year old male.

11/29 – Orchard Avenue Elementary – a male was found deceased in the alley way behind the school, there was blood around the male's face when he was found, unknown cause of death at time of briefing.

11/30 – Escalante Canyon area – SARC responded for two subjects stranded in the snow the a broken axel on their vehicle; 3505 N 12th Street – GJPD Street Crimes Unit took one male in to custody on 1st degree assault and other charges after he stabbed his girlfriend.

Victim Services Program

Summary

Meetings/events:

- Provided training about “LE and Victim Services” to the S.A.R.T. training group at CMU
- Attended meeting of Domestic Violence Task Force
- Attended meeting of the Western Slope Volunteer Management Association
- Coordinator and three other VAPs participated in a debriefing for counselors at GJHS, at the invitation of Karen Vermeulen, coordinator of the District Crisis Psychological Support Team. (VAPs were also called out to the suicide at GJHS, which accounts for the increased number of reported victims this month. Nine VAPs responded to the scene.)

Training:

- Monthly VAP meeting included a presentation of “Ending the Silence” by VAPs Jenn Daniels and Craig White. This is the youth mental health awareness program being offered in our school district (and often presented by Jenn Daniels).

Other:

- Presented to the VALE Board “oral board,” an annual requirement of those submitting or renewing grants with VALE Board.
- Volunteer placed 72 follow-up phone calls to victims of inactivated property crimes (left messages for 45 of these welfare calls who did not answer)
