Summary-

10/2 – Mary’s Loop – female patient crashed her bike and had obvious leg injuries, MCSO, SARC and Lower Valley Fire responded; Wild Horse Area - SARC dispatched for a male, female and 7 week old infant stuck in the mud.

10/7 – ASSTL to Garfield County – a male subject from Denver drove to Carbondale and shot his ex-girlfriend multiple times, in front of her 3 year old child, the male then took the child to a family members house in Grand Junction and told the family member what he had done, law enforcement tracked the subject to a local motel where he and his current girlfriend were taken in to custody;

Clifton City Market – a male subject was threatening to kill people with a sword, he was transported to Mind Springs; Lombardy Lane – three clowns with bats and flashlights were reported in the area, MCSO checked a vacant house that was the “clown base camp” but no subjects were located; 2940 Riverbend Lane – female subject cut a males Achilles’ tendon then fled, she was later contacted and arrested on Good Hope Circle.

10/15 – Micaela’s Court – a realtor was showing a house when the neighbor at 1149 Micaela’s Court came outside and said he was going to burn his house down, the GJPD contacted the male subject then left the area, a couple of hours later the male set his house on fire, it was knocked down fairly quick and the male was arrested.

10/19 – Rash of car thefts, similar to last winter when one car would be taken and driven to another location and another vehicle then stolen, 14011 A $\frac{3}{4}$ Road – 57 year old male with a self-inflicted gunshot wound found in DOA in the driveway; 10th and Ute – vehicle crash with multiple subjects injured, three ambulances responded to the accident.

10/20 – 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ Road and Main Street – a transgender female went to the wrong apartment building, she woke up the resident and attempted to get into bed with her assuming it was her friend she had recently argued with, the subject was taken in to custody; 2828 Orchard Avenue #18 – units responded to a suicidal male subject with a knife to his throat outside the residence, he eventually put down the weapon and was taken in to custody without incident.

10/22 – 1171 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ Road – a crashed motorcycle was found unattended, the rider was found DOA two hours later in a canal gate about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the motorcycle.

10/23 – I-70/Mile Marker 17 – a semi-truck hit a guardrail and left his bumper behind, continued on to MM19 where he crashed again and ended up in the river, the driver was not injured; while law enforcement was dealing with that accident a vehicle passing by had its transmission seize up and catch fire; Coon Creek – brush fire was reported and extinguished fairly quickly.

10/25 – Western Hills Trailer Park – an intoxicated male subject attempted to enter the wrong address, the female inside had a gun and there was concern she might shoot the subject, officers arrived and detained the male subject, the subject had warrants and was subsequently arrested; 3152 F $\frac{1}{2}$ Road – a female subject sent messages to her ex-fiancé and father of her children stating she had spiked the children’s drinks and that she was going to kill herself, the female had access to weapons and one of the children messaged the father begging for help, deputies responded to the address and CPS intervened; 526 Arrowleaf Drive – a 9 year old child was found “running away from home” and refused any assistance, deputies contacted him about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile from his house and escorted him back home.

10/30 – Vehicle pursuit of murder suspect wanted out of Utah, the suspect fled and drove the wrong way on multiple streets, eluding officers and attempting several car jacking’s, suspect was finally caught and arrested without incident.
