# Victim Services Program

## Summary

### Meetings/events:

- With Service Volunteer Coordinator Jeanne, planned and prepared annual volunteer appreciation dinner on 9/20/16. The new VAPs in training were also invited in lieu of an additional graduation recognition.
- Coordinator attended monthly meeting of Domestic Violence Task Force
- Coordinator attended monthly meeting of Western Slope Volunteer Management Association
- Coordinator and practicum student (Kari Sewell) attended quarterly meeting of Disaster Behavioral Health Coalition
- Presented “The Role of Victim Services in Law Enforcement” to the Citizen’s Public Safety Academy

### Training:

- VAP training academy for seven new VAPs was held two evenings per week through the end of September, with topics in: domestic violence from a LE perspective, criminal justice procedures, communication skills, dynamics of child & adult sexual assault, SANE procedure, trauma response, coroner’s duties & protocol, grief & bereavement practices, vicarious trauma, cultural considerations, traffic crash protocol, victim funds, ethics in advocacy, and legal resources

### Other:

- Coordinator completed VALE grant renewals for victim services (phone and mileage reimbursements for volunteers) and crime emergency fund (shared with Latimer House and MCSO)
- Coordinator had extended follow-up with family of 7 @ Coronado Way, site of DTF/SWAT incident
