Summary-

12/2 – Grand Mesa – MCSO SARC responded to a missing National Guard solider, he was found safe and unharmed.

12/3 – a mother called in stating there were two 14 year old males at her address that were drunk, high and on probation, the mother refused an ambulance but wanted to talk to an officer about what she should do with them, 25 minutes later units were dispatched to the home and requested a squad immediately as both juveniles were not alert and one had a severe laceration on his hand, they were both transported C2 to St. Mary's for overdose; Mind Springs – answering service reported a suicidal/homicidal male subject claiming he was turned away and was to hurt himself or kill someone, the facility was placed on lock down while the subjects phone was tracked; Toy Drive – several units on TAC 2 blocking roads for the toy drive which had 509 motorcycles participating; 820 Rood Avenue – 42 year old female found hanging, DOA; 3 crashes at the same time – 30 Road/I 70 B – hit and run, alcohol involved and 1 patient taken C2 to Community Hospital – 30 Road / I70 Frontage Road – vehicle on its side, no injuries were reported – 28 ½

Road / I 70 B – motor vehicle accident, no injuries reported; Broadway & Kansas Avenue – 17 year old male driver rolled his vehicle while he was under the influence of marijuana and alcohol, driver sustained minor injuries.

12/5 – multiple calls came in from a 9-1-1 only phone, the subject was wanting to report a sex assault, an indecent exposure, a robbery, a stolen truck with someone chasing them and trying to kill them, Fruita PD responded to the area but did not find anyone; A & W Trailer Park – a male was taking out his trash and found a male subject lying face down and bloody, the subject was DOA and the GJPD started an investigation; Hwy 50 – to and from Delta – 2nd day in a row that a white BMW was reported speeding over 100 mph, CSP is actively looking for the vehicle; 1445 Main Street – 17 year old male found with a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head, he was transported C3 to St. Mary's, unknown status at time of transport.

12/9 – a suspect in the stabbing at the A & W Trailer Park was taken in to custody; A known female subject called Dispatch multiple times and was at two different hotels on Horizon Drive at different times, she was blocking in her ex-husband's car waiting for law enforcement, she pulled the fire alarm while at the 2nd hotel, was finally arrested and her vehicle towed to impound; A white Chrysler 300 that eluded officers on previous nights was spotted in the area of Horizon Drive, subjects were tracked to a local hotel, the hotel requested an eviction of the room and during the civil standby officers saw drug paraphernalia, bullet proof vests, and various firearms, the PD requested a search warrant for the room; 928 White Avenue #1 – three acquaintances of the reporting party robbed the RP at gunpoint and took his vehicle, money and electronics; A subject called in and said that he "was not feeling OK" with himself, units were sent to his address where he was arrested on four warrants.

12/10 – 624 31 ½ Road – a fight was reported with weapons seen, CSP was the first to arrive on scene and requested C3 backup from MCSO, multiple shotguns and assault rifles found in the vehicle, one female had facial injuries, one subject discharged a gun into the air; 2851 ¼ Emily Drive – male subject, that painted himself with paint thinner and was referring to himself as Jesus, was taken to St. Mary's for a psych evaluation; The subject in a remove incident from the day before was spotted at a local gas station, he had previously called in a fake robbery in an unsuccessful attempt to ambush the responding officers, he, and the female subject with him, were arrested without incident at Love's Truck Stop, he was in possession of a stolen gun and the vehicle they were driving had stolen license plates taken earlier the same day.

12/11 – 424 32 Road #379 - 24 year old male found with a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head; I70 mile marker 24 – motor vehicle accident with four patients, extrication needed, all four were transported C2 to St. Mary's; 2982 ½ Hall

Avenue – a male subject was arguing with himself and discharged a firearm into the ground, appeared to be Code 5.

12/20 – 390 Evergreen Road – structure fire in a shed that was fully involved, one GJFD firefighter was injured when an aerosol can burst and flew through the wall, the impact cracked his helmet and he was taken C2 to Community Hospital for a concussion; 2813 C ³/₄ Road – two know subjects barricaded themselves in the residence, GJPD and MCSO street crimes units initially responded to the incident, SWAT, negotiators and IDT were called out to respond as well, the female who was barricaded was posting on social media about the incident while it was occurring.

12/25 − DeBeque Kum & Go − a 2 year old child strapped in a car seat was locked in a running vehicle with a dog, the RP could not get a hold of a locksmith, the DeBeque Marshal was called out, as he was en route bystanders were able to get the door open using a laser pointing to get the dogs attention, they pointed the laser at the unlock button and he pounced on it, unlocking the door...Brilliant!; 1060 North Avenue − CMU Little Mavs Daycare − male subject jumped the fence of the facility and broke into the building, slit his throat with a large knife, officers could not get a pulse, an ambulance transported the male C3 to St. Mary's.

12/26 – Cottonwood #4 – SARC responded to two snowmobilers stuck in the snow, the subjects were able to get themselves out before help arrived; Riverside Parkway/5th Street – minor injury crash, the Parkway was closed for a short time; 744 Old 6 & 50 – a subject had a knife and was threatening to cut his wrists after a fight with his uncles; 521 Campbell Way – a male living at the residence shot himself in the leg as he was removing the clip from a handgun.

12/30 – 324 Fairview Avenue – structure fire was contained to the attic and did not extend to the home; Wells Fargo North Avenue – during a traffic stop GJPD officer requested C3 backup for 2 at gunpoint; 875 Main Street/Ratekin Tower – GJPD responded to a burglary in progress and requested C3 backup, a suspect was tazed and taken in to custody, two PD officers were taken to St. Mary's for minor injuries; 4 Road/S Road – one vehicle rollover, two patients were transported with minor injuries.

12/31 – 233 Chipeta – a known suspect pointed a gun at their mother in-law's boyfriend; multiple calls for parties, firework complaints and fights; several suicide attempts (none successful); CAD went down at midnight for about 10 minutes; 2756 Redwood Ct. – three people were reportedly stabbed; 245 Teller Avenue – residents woke up to the sound of things breaking in their house, an unknown male subject was found inside the residence.
